LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Jan,

First I would like to compliment you on your effective managing of the SCMA, which is no easy task as I know first hand, but it also is quite rewarding as well when one knows that the effort is effective, and appreciated by many.

I would like to thank you on the way you have kept the Association running, and the newsletter informative and enlightening.

I am well aquatinted with the newsletter as I was the originator of said publication after I joined the SCMA in the fifties as an outrider. At that time Dale Stoddard, who was the gentleman that originated the SCMA, and his vice president, Ellis Smith were doing an adequate job of attempting to get this organization on it's feet and moving ahead, and I became totally enmeshed in the whole concept of the plan to buck the AMA that at that time was not too overly friendly toward a new-comer on the block. I jumped in with both feet, and my wife did too, and we soon found that there was little time for much of anything else in our lives as we struggled with new ideas and methods to get this organization up and running. I am proud to say that I was able to originate the newsletter, the concept of having outriders as well as club members holding full memberships and privileges, and establishing outrider zones, and areas throughout the country, as well as parts of Europe, etc.

Unfortunately, along the way most of the growth of the Association was abandoned, until it is now about the same size as it was when I first became involved, except that now outriders have full memberships, as well as clubs, and voting privileges extend to all members, and I once again am proud that I was able to fight to establish this practice.

I was also proud to have designed the flag, and emblem of the SCMA, and hand made the flag myself, and sewed it together on my wife's sewing machine. My then brother in law, was the brother in law of the family that owned the embroydery company in LA that I took my ideas to and together we made the first shoulder patches, and parts of the flag as well. It would take me another fifty years to recount all of my feelings toward the SCMA, but suffice it to say, it was my life and still is a large part of my world and history.

I also worked as the sales manager at Los Angeles Harley Davidson, and the owner and I, Dick Hutchens, began the California 500 and 1000, motorcycle tours, and I mapped out all of them until Dick sold out, and went to Yucca Valley, and then I went there to be sales manager as well, but the traveling became too much for me, and I reluctantly resigned my position. Dick and I remained friends though nevertheless.

Illness, and disabilities have crept up and made my riding days just a memory now, but I can still feel the urges to throw my leg over a Milwaukee Vibrator and hit the road......

My hearing has also diminished, and although I have a cochlear implant, it does little to alleviate the problem of understanding the spoken word.

I might add that I felt saddened by the passing of Joe Usatin, who was a stalwart of the Assn. even though we sometimes differed on procedures, but that is just human. We used to ride together on so many different run, etc., and he was a true rider.

I hope I didn't boor you with my discourse, but I have so many things that I can recall and the way we, in the beginning, had to fight for every bit of ground to put the SCMA into the forefront of the motorcycling scene.

I hope that you have a wonderful Christmas, and a rewarding New Year!

New Years Day Ride 2008

What a way to bring in the New Year! We started the year with a ride called the SCMA California Parks Adventure, a new AMA Grand Tour Event. You have to go to all-24 National parks in California from Jan 1 to Dec 15. You must get your California Parks passport stamped with the park stamp and take a photo of your motorcycle or you and your motorcycle next to the park sign or something that you can tell what National park your at.

A small group of riders met up in Ontario at the old Union 76 truck stop (now a TA stop). Jerry (Honda VFR 800) and I rode in from the west side of Los Angeles as Steve and Susan (Honda Gold Wing) came in from Canyon Country. The day was a beautiful sunny day to





start but not long after we got on the road from the truck stop, the wind hit us! The wind started around Redlands and was very gusty at times. It was blowing me around a lot on my Suzuki V-Strom 650.


With all the wind, the temperature dropped some as well as we got closer to highway 62 that would bring us up to our first National Park – Joshua tree. As we got closer to Joshua tree the temperature dropped again into the low 40's. This was not too bad for Steve and Susan who both have heated gear, but for Jerry who did not get his riding suit out today it was going to be a cold day. I had my Spidi gloves and riding pants and an ok warm jacket as my feet were kept warm with my SIDI Strada boots. It's nice to have water resistant boots as they really do keep your feet feeling nice all day long.

Joshua Tree was the first stamp of the year for us and we were greeted nicely by the park rangers as they asked us about the ride and took flyers so that the head of the park can check out what we are doing, and with any luck, ask for flyers to hand out at the park.

Next up was the ride up to Mojave National Preserve and the Kelso station. It was nice to see other groups of motorcycle riders out on the road today as we headed for Kelso. Kelso is an old train depot and very cool to check out. They have a nice 12 minute film and when you walk in it still has the U-shaped dinner that use to feed many train goers why back when. This is a place for you to check out as it's very nice and remodeled as the National Preserves visitor center. They even have fright trains going by and if you're a train buff, it's a good place to take some photos, as they are not going too fast there. On the ride up Kelbaker road to Kelso, we hit 37 degrees, so it was cold in many places.

The ride home was a fun one as we got back to highway 40 or still route 66 in places. We made a stop in Ludlow for fuel and were surprised with a beautiful fiery sunset all nice and red with the mix of dark clouds. Back on the road it was the first time any of us ever saw a bicycle laying in a lane of the freeway and we all hoped that someone did not hit it. We stopped in Barstow for dinner and to warm up. After dinner we were on the road again.





AMA Grand Tour Event --- A Year Long Event —



Rules of the Tour

- With each park visit, stamp your Passport w/ that parks' stamp, available at the visitor's center (Please call ahead to confirm visitor center hours).
- Be sure to take a photograph of you or your motorcycle in front of one of the following: the entrance, the visitor's center, or some landmark within that is unique to that park.
- ♦ All 24 National Parks in California must be visited between Jan. 1st & Dec. 15th of the calendar year.


