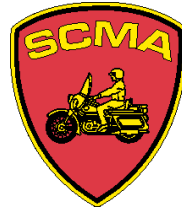

FROM THE CHAIR

It is the morning/afternoon of the night after. The night after the first Triple Crown Awards banquet which was quite a success. We had close to 70 attendees who I think had a very enjoyable evening.

Ten of the eleven Triple Crown Award were there to receive recognition for their accomplishment, along with many others who did one or two of the events that make up the Triple Crown Award. We had several Traveler's Award participants who had made the required events which allowed them to enjoy the banquet at no cost (this is the last year we will offer that opportunity since it is not cost effective) had the opportunity to enjoy a good meal, some unexpected entertainment (Steve Zinkow's tale of his adventures of Four Corners kept everyone in laughter) and see what the riders received for accepting the challenge of CPA, Four Corners and Three Flags.

We had T-shirts made for the California Parks Adventure and long sleeve denim dress shirts for the Triple Crown event and sold all but 1T-shirt and 2 dress shirts.

I am working with Holley at H&H Industries to develop a link on our web site that will make purchases of these items available, including Four Corners T-shirts, both long and short sleeve. No one ever saw these except at the banquet. We have a lot of stock on Four Corners shirts we would like to sell.

What with all the rain for the past few weeks it has been hard to know whether the Sweetheart Ride was going to get a chance to happen. Still do not know at this time, but should it get rained out and we have to, what we will do is run it either in April or June, we will have to wait and see.

Also, we have put an extra Traveler's Award ride on our schedule, with Dannie Fox's permission of course. The PMC Green Horn Ride, May 2nd. & 3rd. will be handled just like the Shamrock's 2-dayer is being done. Saturday will be considered the Traveler's ride day and we will work the check point if they want us to. The ride will start at Cycle Gear, Newhall, sign-in from 6am to 8am. Gregg Thompson is very happy about this and he hopes it will bring a few more riders out for this event, which has suffered a decline in ridership for several years now. It is a good ride and I hope you all support it as best possible. See flyer elsewhere in this newsletter.

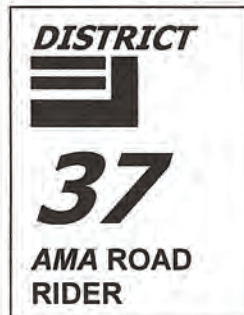

THREE FLAGS DRAWING

2009 Three Flags Classic drawing was held on January 24, 2009 at the Carson VFW hall in Torrance and we had a great turn out as usual.

As most of you know we have used several different school auditoriums in the past but they are no longer available to us at a reasonable price, so we had to seek alternative venues. My first thought was a restaurant but then it would be hard to provide coffee, donuts, soft drinks and bagels at a reasonable price from the restaurant, next thought was to find a fraternal organization that rented out their hall and had a kitchen where we could do "our thing".

My friend Kathy, who works for H & H Industries, just happens to have a sister who manages a VFW hall in Carson and upon going to check it out found it to be just what we were looking for.

The price was right and on top of that we were able to have the Ladies Auxiliary provide breakfast for the group at a great price also. The ladies cooked up scrambled eggs, sausage, ham, potatoes, biscuits and gravy, orange juice and coffee. We treated our riders to breakfast prior to doing the drawing and I think they enjoyed it, some went back for seconds and there was more than enough food for everyone.

The hall cost \$300.00 and breakfast was \$5.00 per serving, best part we came in on budget.

We had 244 entries, 80 from Canada alone, 49 double entries (two names being drawn together, individual ticket number issued, one per rider) and the balance of entries were single entries. We drew 225 entries, have 19 entries on the waiting list. We had several entries from outside the Continental USA which do not have to go into the draw, committee members and Traveler Award participants who qualified getting tickets without going into the draw. Every one pays for their tickets, no free rides with the exception of the person who wins the ticket drawn at the end of the banquet each year for the next year's event.

After the drawing the committee sat down, compared the ticket numbers assigned to the names drawn and we were able to put the notification cards in the mail that afternoon. Refunds will be sent out to those whose names were not drawn and their information will be available to anyone who needs to sell their ticket for whatever reason later in the year. Since the advent of the forum however, most of those transactions happen on the web site. When you sell your ticket you should inform us what ticket number you had and who you sold it to so we may keep our records up to date. It would be nice also if you made sure the party you are selling the ticket to contacts us to give us their data so we don't have to do all that at the start of the event, it is very time consuming and you cannot believe how many tickets change hands towards the start of the event. Nine months is a long time and a lot can happen in your life to change the course of events you have planned.

Next chore is getting the ticket and the ticket holder ready for mailing, hope to have them in the mail by the March meeting.

That's it for now, have more for you next month.

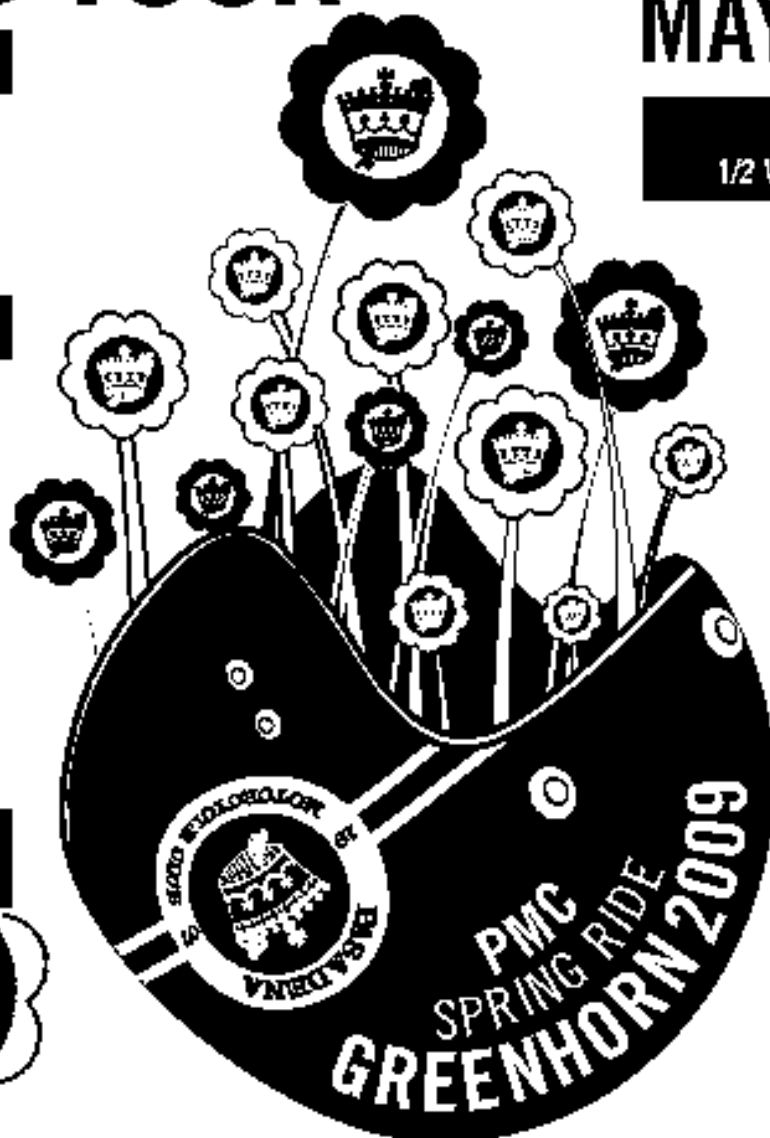

And so, as one smart bear once said..."If you live to be a hundred, I want to live to be a hundred minus one day, so I never have to live without you." — *Winnie the Pooh*



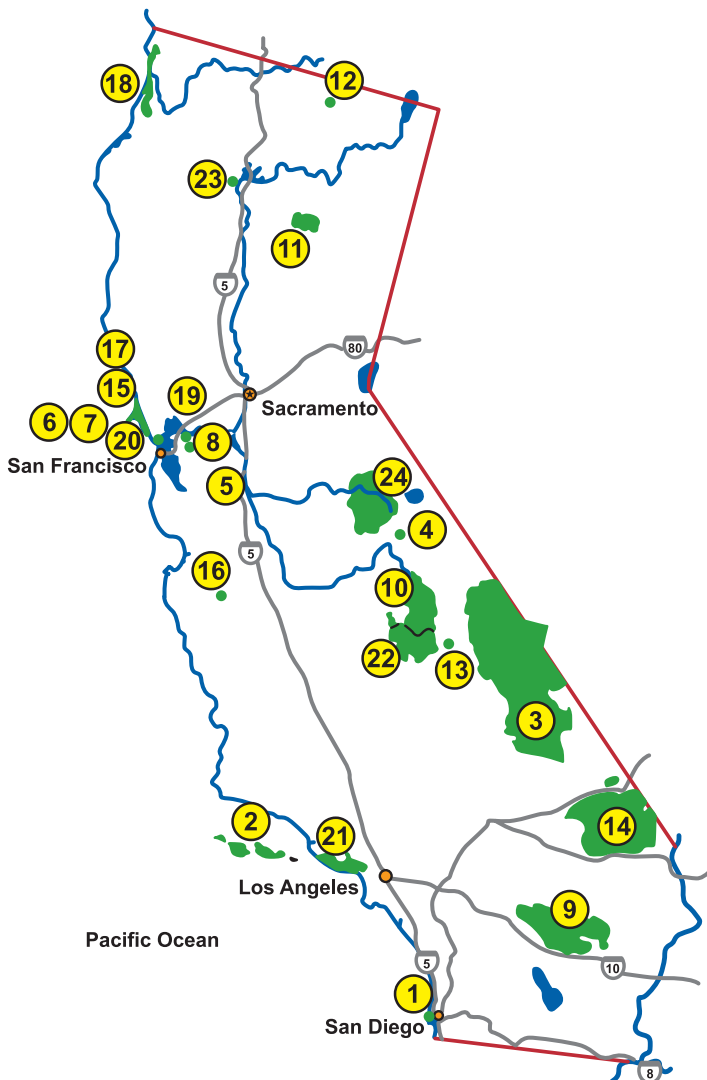

DEPLETED LICENSE PLATES, OVERBOOKED RIDER ED COURSES

As a sign of the times, with a record number of motorcyclists on the road and increasing numbers of motorcycle registrations, rider training courses in numerous locations across the country have been booked solid and now officials in Kansas have reported running out of motorcycle license plates.

The Hutchinson News reported that the problem is bad enough that counties with plentiful plates are being asked to share with other counties. "We are out of motorcycle tags, and we don't know when we'll get more," said Reno County Treasurer Clark Miller. "We've begged and borrowed from other counties," he told the newspaper, "but we can't get more."

When the state made its annual tag order, gas prices hadn't reached their current levels and officials didn't anticipate the resulting demand from motorists switching to more fuel-efficient transportation.

At least one motorcycle owner complained to the newspaper of being sent away from the DMV office this week and advised not to drive his motorcycle until it was properly tagged, with no promise of when tags might be available.

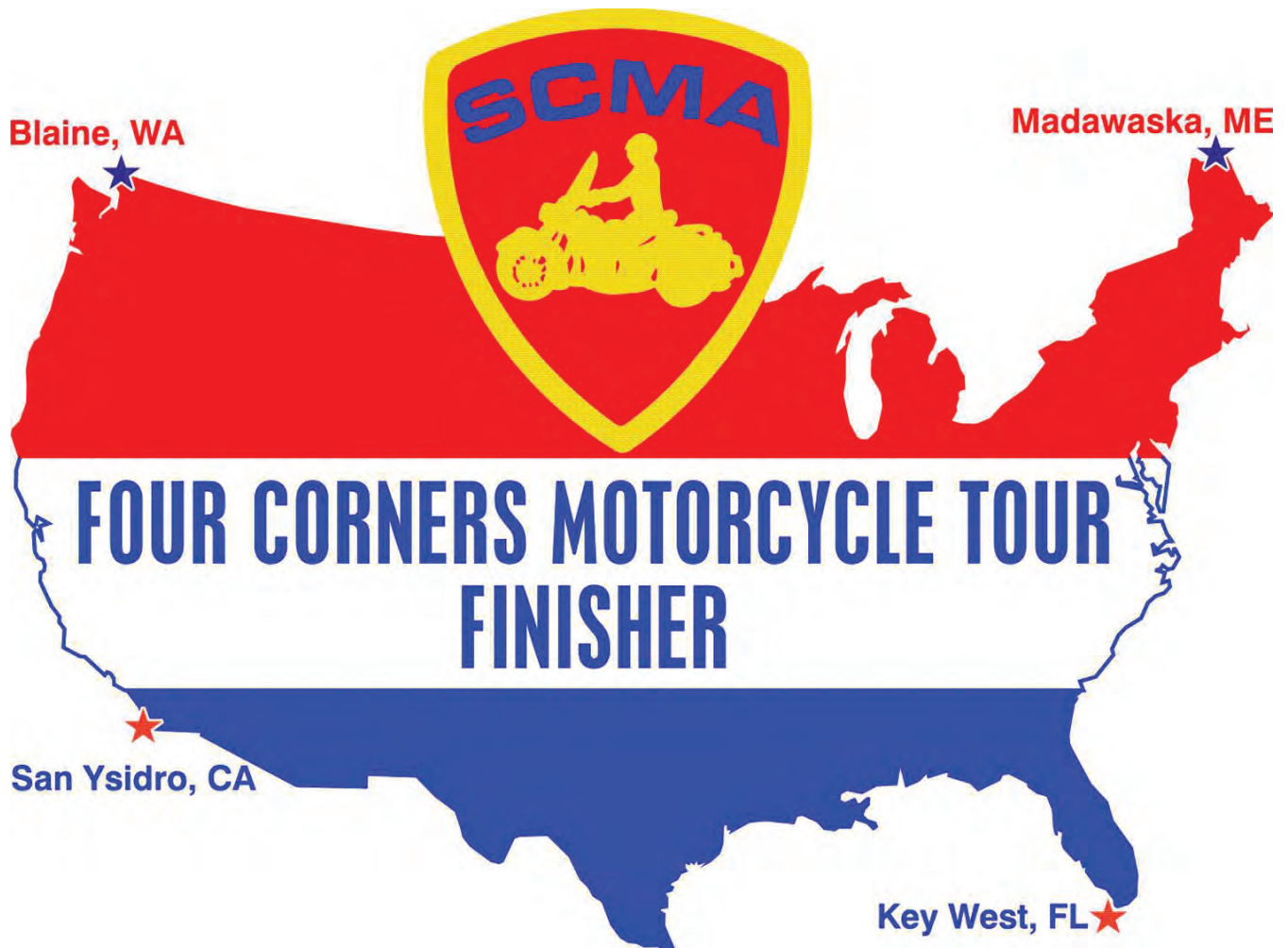
