



TRIPLE CROWN BANQUET

On February 20, 2010, SCMA hosted the second annual Triple Crown Banquet at the Hotel Menage in Anaheim, California which was attended by 28 people. Because SCMA is based in California, most of its rides throughout the year occur in Southern California. In 2009, there were 17 rides or events.

One of the events, now in its third year, is the California Parks Adventure. Over the course of a year, a rider has to visit 24 National Parks, Monuments, Historic Sites or Recreation Areas in California. There were 23 finishers in 2009.

Due to the nature of the next two events, SCMA draws riders from all over North America. On the Four Corners Motorcycle Tour, a rider has 21 days to ride to the four corners of the continental United States: San Ysidro, California, Key West, Florida, Madawaska, Maine and Blaine, Washington. The rider can start and end at any corner. They do not have to return to the first corner to complete the tour. There were 55 finishers from: California (14), Canada (9), Nevada, Texas, and Virginia (4 ea), Montana and North Carolina (3 ea), Alaska, Florida, Maine (2 ea), and Arizona, Connecticut, Georgia, Illinois, Kentucky, Maryland, Washington and Washington D.C. (1 ea).

The other event is the Three Flags Classic. The 2009 Classic started in Mexicali, Baja California on September 4 and ended in Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada on September 7. The ride was a 2,156 mile adventure through the states of California, Arizona, Utah, Nevada, and Montana. There were 216 starters, with 4 not finishing. There were 145 participants from the United States, 105 from California, 68 from Canada and 3 from Mexico.

If a rider completed the California Parks Adventure, Four Corners Motorcycle Tour and the Three Flags Classic in the same calendar year, they were awarded a beautiful Triple Crown award. In 2009, there were 8 finishers. Joe Mandeville is a repeat finisher, having also finished in 2008. Joe has done a total of 7 Four Corners Tours. The other recipients were: Charles Lamb from Hopewell, Virginia. (See footnote). Charles has done a total of 3 Four Corners Tours, one in 2008 and two in 2009, and Les and Joyce Long, from Redding, California who each ride their own Gold Wings, plus Dennis Even, Dannie Fox, John Katics, and Bob Masuzumi. This is the second Four Corners Tour for Dannie Fox and John Katics.

Participants of the Four Corners Tour at the banquet were: Neil Noffsinger, from Spring, Texas, his third year in a row completing the Tour. Cynthia Black and Brenda Cox from Billings, Montana. Ester Weis Younglady, one of the ladies' daughters from Bozeman, Montana. The day Ester and the other ladies departed Montana was her 24th birthday. All three are members of the Motor Maids, Inc., which is the oldest women's motorcycling organization in North America, celebrating their 70th anniversary. And Earl Black, from Iron Station, North Carolina.

Other participants were: Jim Bullen and Paul Hanley (Three Flags and California Parks), Leroy and Judith Ann Hart and Edward Westlund (California Parks), and Dean and Lois Yates (Three Flags Classic),

You did not have to be a participant of the rides to attend the banquet. Also in attendance were: Ray and Bonnie Davis. Ray was a recipient of last year's Triple Crown award who has completed thirteen Four Corners Tours, Jan Staws, Chairperson of SCMA, Kenn and Phyllis Hatke, SCMA Treasurer and Secretary and the Banquet Coordinators, Holley Harrison, from H & H Industries, Diane Even, and Barbara Fox.

(Footnote: The following is an email that I received from Charles Lamb. I had asked him if he was retired and if he had participated in the 2008 Triple Crown. With his permission, I am sharing it in this article. Charles is the only Triple Crown recipient that lives outside of California.)

I had a great time at the Banquet. Thanks to all! On Sunday morning, I will be taking off to Hawaii to get my 50th State on a motorcycle.

I started long distance riding in May 2008 with the SCMA US Four Corners ride. It was my first 'long ride' (ie over 1500 miles). I had completed a couple of IBA rides in the fall of 2007.

My son-in-law (Chris DeMarco) and I met in Key West, after he finished his final exams at the University of Florida, to start on an adventure to visit the Four Corners and 48 States in less than 21 days. It was a great time and ride. He completed the ride on a Harley Davidson Sportster. How, he did it without a single complaint, I do not know. Youth I guess. Doing 48 states at the same time, ended up making it the 'longest' Four Corners Tour of 2008.

I am still working full time as an engineer, so I was saving my vacation time and planning my 2009 rides over the winter of 2008/09.

The second Four Corners was completed with a co-worker - Ken Moody. We stacked a series of rides together: Four Corners, a portion of the California Parks, IBA Ultimate Coast to Coast (Key West to Deadhorse, AK) and IBA Parks Gold Parks Adventure. We were also going to complete the IBA 50CC, but I had mechanical problem in St Charles, LA and we lost about 6 hours getting the bike repairs completed.

On the return from Alaska, I left the bike in Seattle, WA for service.

In late August, I returned to complete the third Four Corners and Three Flags ride on the way home. Due to time constraints, I put the two rides together and ended up traveling over 10,000 miles on the third Four Corners. I could not find anyone dumb enough to go with me on the third round.

All three of the Four Corners had been started in different corners (Key West, Madawaska and Blaine).

In 2010, if time permits, I plan on completing the Triple Crown for the second time. This time, I will start in San Ysidro. Long term, I plan on doing the three long legs in sequence to complete the Four Corners in the form of an "X": San Ysidro to Madawaska to Blaine to Key West.

My wife has never been on the bike. Maybe someday I can talk her into riding. Anyway, she lets me enjoy the ride. In 2008 I did not complete the California Parks or Three Flags. I did complete several other IBA rides.

Ride safe and keep the rubber side down.

HALF A BILLION E-CYCLES TO HIT THE ROAD

Worldwide sales of electric powered two-wheel vehicles are set to explode over the next six years. According to a recently released study by U.S. based firm, Pike Research, 466 million e-bikes, e-motorcycles and e-scooters will be on the road by 2016.

"Demographics and economics are aligning to create a strong market opportunity for two-wheel electric vehicles," Pike's industry analyst Dave Hurst told Cycle Canada. "In some countries, these vehicles will be engines of economic growth, while in others they will be signals of broader consumer behavioral shifts."

Not surprisingly Hurst claims that China will dominate the global electric two-wheel vehicle market, representing more than 95% of sales during the next six years. E-bikes will hold a 56% share of the market, predicts Hurst, followed by e-motorcycles at 43% and e-scooters in distant third with less than 1%.

HOUSE COMMITTEE APPROVES LANE SPLITTING IN ARIZONA

A bill to allow "Lane Splitting" in Arizona has been unanimously approved by legislative committee.

Also known as white lining, or "filtering" as it is commonly referred to in Europe, motorcycles are allowed to weave between lines of cars in heavy traffic. Such practice is legal in the United States only in California and Washington, D.C., but HB2475 would allow lane splitting through stopped traffic in Maricopa County only to begin with for a one-year trial starting next year.

"The biggest factor on this bill is SAFETY and to try and reduce the number of rear end accidents," said Mick Degan, lobbyist for the Modified Motorcycle Association (MMA) of Arizona. "DPS is behind and support of this bill along with AAA."


Also advocating for the measure is former California cop Ted Storck who wrote to the Arizona Republic newspaper; "As an ex-Los Angeles police officer, I support House Bill 2475, which would allow Arizona motorcyclists to split lanes. It is allowed in California and has proven to be safe. I never once investigated an accident where a motorcyclist had an accident due to passing other vehicles in the same lane when the freeways were slow or stopped. However, it did result in more and more people riding motorcycles, cutting down on traffic congestion. Even the head of the California Highway Patrol agrees that this California law should remain in effect. He agrees it cuts traffic congestion and has not resulted in any extra risk to motorcyclists or other vehicles."

The lane splitting bill, sponsored by Republican Rep. Jerry Weiers of Glendale, has already cleared two committees in the House and faces a floor vote soon before it can be considered in the Senate.

OHIO MEASURE WOULD MAKE MOTORCYCLE PARKING SAFER

Buckeye bikers will be able to back their motorcycles into angled parking spaces, under legislation unanimously approved by the Ohio House on March 10. Substitute House Bill 204, sponsored by Rep. Tom Letson, D-Hubbard, passed 96-0 and now heads to the Ohio Senate.



Under existing state law, motor vehicles parked on public streets and highways cannot face into traffic. That poses a problem for people who drive motorcycles, which don't go in reverse, Letson told reporter Marc Kovac, Dix Newspapers Statehouse Bureau chief. For angled parking spaces, motorcyclists have to physically push their bikes into traffic, creating a dangerous situation.

Letson's bill would allow cycles to be backed into angled spaces, instead. "Many of you are probably asking why this is necessary or what this even means," Letson said. "...The purpose for this legislation is to increase safety on Ohio's roadways and to ease the unnecessary burden on Ohio motorcycle drivers."

HIGHWAY SIGNS DELIVER A MESSAGE

Some of the best riding roads are in California, and a new campaign aims to make the roadways safer for motor-cyclists by lighting up over 700 changeable freeway message signs saying "Share the road, look twice for motorcyclist."

Following years of lobbying and letter-writing, ABATE of California is now working with state officials to utilize Amber Alert electronic message boards, when not in official use, to display the motorcycle awareness alert to millions of commuters daily.

ABATE Executive Director Anthony Jaime says the joint effort with CalTrans, the California Highway Patrol and the California Motorcycle Safety Program "highlights the impact that grassroots organizations like ABATE can have on their government when they actively become part of the process of governance rather than just sitting back and being governed."

The signs displayed the messages statewide for a one-week period during peek drive times, and serves as an example that other states can easily follow since it doesn't cost anything extra to do.

Similarly, HB2351 would require the Iowa DOT to use electronic message boards on Hawkeye highways to flash "Watch for Motorcycles" during May for Motorcycle Safety and Awareness Month.
