Three Flags Classic Update

Pre-ride Report

The pre-ride team just returned from Nelson, BC after having driven every mile of the route to confirm it. They said it is gorgeous, challenging and varied. It promises to give us many good miles as we ride from El Paso to Nelson. The start, finish and three checkpoint locations are ready for us. Here's the latest:

The 2012 Three Flags Schedule, August 30 to September 4 (No change, re-posted as an FYI)

- Registration and check-in at El Paso is Thursday 2-6PM and 8-9PM.
- The start in El Paso is Friday 3-6 AM.
- Checkpoint #1 in Buena Vista, CO is open Friday noon-8PM and Saturday 6AM-noon.
- Checkpoint #2 in Little America, WY is open Saturday 8AM-8PM and Sunday 8AM-noon.
- Checkpoint #3 in Wisdom, MT is open Sunday 8AM-8PM and Monday 8AM-noon.
- Finish in Nelson is open Monday noon-9PM.
- Banquet in Nelson is Tuesday evening.

Start & Finish Hotel Reservations (as of June 23):

El Paso: Only singles still available at the Airport Best Western. Singles & doubles available at the Ramada Inn (our overflow hotel). Ramada Inn is 3.5 miles east of the Best Western on the same highway. Call (915) 779-7700 and mention SCMA Three Flags Classic. Make sure you are talking to the El Paso Airport Best Western front desk and that you haven't been rolled to Best Western's national call center.

Nelson: Singles and suites available at the Prestige Lakeside Resort. Singles, doubles and suites are available at the Prestige Inn. Trolley service connect the two. Call (877) 737-8443 and mention SCMA Three Flags Classic.

Checkpoint #2 in Little America, WY

Keep in mind that Little America is little more than an over grown truck stop with limited accommodations. It will be better to find lodging elsewhere along the route.

Checkpoint #3 in Wisdom, MT

This checkpoint is in a four-block-long town with a tiny motel and a restaurant. Lodging is essentially unavailable. This vear the committee intentionally selected checkpoints that

Three Flags Classic Update (Continuing)

would encourage the riders to be curious and creative in seeking out suitable lodging along the route. The checkpoints are essentially not your default choice.

The Finish, Nelson BC

The Prestige Lakeside Resort and the Prestige Inn will combine to become our finish hotels. They are separated by a large parking lot and a street. A trolley is available to transport guests back and forth. Singles, doubles and suites are available at the Inn. Singles and suites only are available at the Resort.

Crossing back into the USA

Our pre-ride team is back with one note of concern. US Border Patrol agents seemed to be spending an extraordinary amount of time inspecting vehicles for contraband. This backs up the line quite a distance and it means that you may spend some serious time at the border crossing. Remember to build this into your considerations as you plan your route home.

Official Passports

Passports are essential for entering Canada and entering the US. You must have a current passport. Check yours today.

Wrist Bands

We will issue wrist bands again this year. Please wear them until you get to the finish. They are an important personal identifier and they allow start point and checkpoint volunteers to confirm that you are registered for the ride.

Tee Shirt Orders

The deadline to order your tee shirt size has passed. The default size is extra large for riders that did not specify a size.

Buying and Selling Ride Tickets

If you need to buy or sell a ticket to the 2012 Three Flags Classic, go to the SCMA website, scroll down to "Three Flags Classic", click on "Forum" (in the upper lefthand corner of the page), click on tickets. Forum first timers must register. Buy and sell activity really picks up in August.

Dannie Fox: A Three Flags Classic Legacy and a Willingness to Serve

Dannie Fox received a Cushman Scooter when he was 10 years old. That was 1955. He would bang around on that scooter on a San Joaquin Valley oil lease. He will tell you that beat-up scooter had only two speeds: idle and full blast. What

a sight that must have been!

He had sense enough to stop riding in junior high but picked up riding again in 1966 as a student at Fresno State College when he bought a brand new 250cc Yamaha. He graduated to larger and larger bikes over the years including the Goldwing and the BMW R1200RT he owns today.

Dannie's biggest claim to fame is this: he has completed 33 of the 36 Three Flags Classic Tours that SCMA has presented every year since 1976. He missed the first two (because he simply had not heard about it) and crashed early on the ride in 1986. That's a remarkable record. In 2012 he will ride his



34th. As youthful and healthy as he is today, we bet he will continue to extend his record for years to come.

But more than completing the TFC 33 times and the USA Four Corners 4 times, Dannie has been a TFC volunteer on several committees and has been our Travelers Award Chairman since 2008.

We asked Dannie what is it about long distance motorcycling that attracts him and said this, "knowing that my favorite road is going to be the next road because I never know what I will find around the next corner"



That pretty much sums it up for most of us and its one of the reasons that Dannie is one of SCMA's inaugural Legacy Award recipients.

Note from the Editor: In late 2011 the SCMA Board of Directors voted unanimously to create a "Legacy Award" to be presented to individuals providing outstanding and long-term service and leadership to SCMA and its riders. Mr. Fox is one of five individuals who received the award in 2012. This is the fourth of five articles highlighting each of these initial Legacy Award recipients. They represent the best of SCMA and are examples of what we look for in others and in ourselves.

Ride Safe: A Dangerous Trend



You may have seen the recent news. Michigan no longer mandates helmets for motorcyclists over 21 years old. The legislature passed a bill and the governor signed it. Michigan is the 31st state to succumb to the pressures of freedom-loving motorcyclists that want the right to decide.

Nationally-respected motorcycling organizations and manufacturers actively lobby against helmet laws. AMA spent \$3.8 million in the last decade lobbying Congress about various laws, including promoting helmet choice. And the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration has been issued a gag order by Congress to stop educating, outreaching or lobbying state legislatures about the dangers of riding without a helmet. Federal funding for motorcycle-only safety checkpoints designed to inspect motorcycles and helmets to promote our safety and welfare has been crushed by the Motorcycle Riders Foundation, ABATE and AMA.

Is this just a bit nuts?

Talk about restricting riding rights. Following a serious head injury, imagine the months not riding--plus the pain, suffering, impact on your loved ones, economic dislocation and perhaps permanent impairment. What



motorcycling gives us can be taken away by our own careless moment or the careless act of another driver. Injured riders with inadequate insurance coverage cost local and state government hundreds of millions of dollars.

Last month I talked about the measurable phenomena of motion-

induced blindness. Given that reality, there is even more reason to protect ourselves from the real possibility of a high speed accident.

Skulls have a lot in common with eggs. They contain the contents but they are not very strong. Our skulls are only ¼" thick. As we evolved, human beings were never exposed to high velocity head injuries we face today-with perhaps the exception of a blow from a stone ax. We moved no faster than a walk or a run. Two hundred

years ago we still moved no faster than the speed of a galloping horse and very few people owned a horse. Less than one hundred years ago motorcycles came into common use. By our very nature, our skulls are simply not designed for a high speed get-off

Here are some relevant facts:

- · 47 states had helmet laws in the late 1970s.
- · 19 states have helmet laws in 2012.
- Motorcycle fatalities have doubled since the mid-1990s. Ridership has not.
- The National Highway Transportation Safety Administration estimates that helmets saved 1,483 lives in 2009.
- A 2008 NHTSA study estimated that \$1.3 billion in medical bills and lost productivity would have been saved if all motorcyclists had worn helmets.
- According to NHTSA: "No other single countermeasure offers a comparable body of scientific evidence confirming its potential for saving lives of motorcyclists."
- Michigan's recent repeal of its helmet law was opposed by a coalition of two dozen medical and public health groups led by the Brain Injury Association of Michigan. Eighty percent of Michigan voters were in favor of keeping the helmet law.
- A 2011 Johns Hopkins
 University study reviewed
 40,000 motorcycle collisions
 and found helmeted riders
 were 22% less likely to
 suffer cervical spine injury,
 debunking the myth that
 helmets cause broken necks
 in an accident.
- Researchers from Michigan State University discovered an unexpected, life-saving benefit when Florida and five other states jettisoned their helmet laws. "Our central estimates show that organ donations due to motor vehicle accidents increase by 10 percent when states repeal helmet laws."

SCMA requires its riders to wear a helmet as a condition of participation. There are 802 reasons why.

The Kootenay Lake Ferry Toward Nelson

TFC riders take note: If you have not already read the discussion in the Three Flags forum about the ferry ride across the lake to reach Nelson, do so now. Go to www.sc-ma.com. Scroll down to "Three Flags Classic" and click. Click on "Forum". Click on "Route" and find the ferry discussion.

Long story short, if you haven't reached Creston, BC by 6PM PDT on Monday Sept 3rd, then going north from there on Highway 3a to the ferry and then west on Highway 3a to Nelson will be risky, time-wise. It will be better strategy to leave Creston heading west on Highway 3 and then north on Highway 6 to Nelson. A look at a map and a read of the forum discussion will clarify this for you.

Basically, the anticipated holiday traffic, limited ferry capacity and not allowing motorcycles to move up to the front of the line on this ferry may mean you will run out of time and miss the 9PM PDT arrival deadline in Nelson. This ride will basically follow the route devel-

oped by Bill Allen for the ride in July 2011.

This is an opportunity to explore the roads through the Sierra Nevada Mountain Passes from Bakersfield to South Lake Tahoe in a three day ride. The routing information and GPS files have been posted for viewing and downloading from the Club the web

site calendar for July 19, 2012.

It is suggested the ride participants stay in Bakersfield Thursday night July 19, 2012. I will be

staying at the <u>Holiday Inn Express at 3001 Buck</u> Owens Blvd. in Bakersfield.

The ride will begin in Bakersfield on Friday morning July 20, 2012. We will meet at 8:00AM at Zingo's Café (3201 Buck Owens Blvd in Bakersfield) for breakfast and an overview of the ride.




Friday morning we will ride Hwy 178 east over

Walker Pass and turn north on 395 to SR 120 and over Tioga Pass at Yosemite and then onto Sonora for Friday evening. I am staying at the

Inns of California in Sonora. Saturday morning

we will leave Sonora and head east and north over Hwy 108 (Sonora Pass) to the 395 north and Hwy 89 over Monitor Pass and then onto to a lunch and fuel break at Marklee Station.

towards Tahoe over Carson Pass and Luther Pass. We will take Hwy 207 over the Kingsbury grade onto meet up with Hwy 395 south into Bishop.

I plan to stay Saturday night at the Ramada Limited Inn in Bishop. Sunday morning we head south on the 395 with a stop at Kramer Junction and then onto I-15



and home. I have posted the route instructions and the GPS files to the calendar for this event.

The ride will consist of 132 miles from LA to Bakersfield. There are 398 miles Day 2 (Bakersfield to Sonora). Then 500 miles Day 3 (Sonora to Bishop). The final leg is 300+ miles for the ride home on Sunday.

There are several long twisty sections of mountain roads, this is probably not a good candidate for a ride two up.

The hotel addresses and telephone numbers are shown within the Route instructions file.

Those of you considering this ride should make your hotel reservations quickly as these hotels fill up early for the summer months weekends.
