
# Announcing the 2012 SCMA Turkey Run By Steve Howe, Ride Chairman

### What Will SCMA Do About 3rd Party Charity Events?

From time-to-time SCMA receives inquiries from our riders about third party charity efforts. The question often sounds like this: "I'm about to go on the USA 4 Corners Tour. I was thinking about raising money for my favorite charity. I want to get people to pledge money for the miles I travel. Is that okay?" A similar question--actually, more of a statement sounds like: "I am going to raise money while on the Mission Tour". Or the Three Flags Classic or the Best 15. You get the point.

At first blush, the easy answer is sure, why not? Well, the board took a very hard look at the question and has developed a policy. You will see it in our ride registration materials and on the back page of the newsletter:

"The SCMA neither endorses nor sanctions any fund raising activities by its members or riders participating in its events for any purpose benefiting or on behalf of third party charities unless expressly stated otherwise. All such activities are outside of the control and view of SCMA and no support of any kind should be construed"

Simply stated, we have little to no information about the rider, the method of collection, the fate of the funds once collected and the charity itself. Without the ability or interest in auditing the charity effort, SCMA and its directors have no informed understanding of what is happening well outside its view and purview.

And so, the SCMA has taken the position quoted in red.

This policy does not preclude SCMA itself from deciding to support a charity on its own. If it were ever to do so, it would be under the condition of being able to sufficiently manage and audit the collection, the retention and the distribution of the funds to a worthy charity of its choosing. Short of that, we decline all involvement.



### Our Visit With Patricia Thompson (Don Davis' Daughter)

Back in August we received word that an old SCMA member had passed away. Don Davis, who had lived up in the Central Valley, had been an active member in the 70s and 80s. Patricia sought us out for two reasons. One was to get the word out to other old timers about Don's passing. The other was to offer Don's old riding vest and collection of riding pins to SCMA. She asked whether we would have any value in them. We said certainly so. We have a roomy storage unit in Buena Park and we would be very interested in archiving Don's old treasures.

As it turned out, SCMA's Grand Tour was scheduled for October 6-7 and would pass right through Exeter where she lives. The SCMA Chairman and other SCMA members could drop by, hear some stories and receive the vest and pins.

We met with Patricia. She provided us with take out from her favorite Mexican restaurant. She told us how proud her dad had been of his years with SCMA. She said that her dad always did things big and became very devoted to riding with SCMA and its affiliated clubs. Back then, SCMA was divided in Areas (see related article in this month's issue). He was an Area B guy.

He participated in the rides put on by the Saddlelites, Bakersfield Red Tops MC, Bakersfield Road Riders, Big Valley MC, Los Amigos MC, Los Padres MC, Taft MC, Simi Valley Road Riders and the Valley Drifters.

He spent time on the big Jamborees of the mid-70s and



early-80s produced by the SCMA and the SRRA (Sierra Road Riders Association). SCMA and SRRA also did Las Vegas events together as well. Campouts were big with SCMA back then and benefit rides were held for charities from time-to-time.

She gave us his 1977 TFC belt buckle. It was marked SCMA and BCRR. That ties in with the other significant treasure she gave us. Among the pins that we received





from Patricia was a 1978 Three Flags Classic Pin that included the initials of SCMA and BCRR (British Columbia Road Riders). During the early years of the Three Flags Classic the Canadians were


partners with SCMA in putting on the TFC. As a young teenager, Patricia rode with her dad on the Three Flags Classic. Those are memories she will carry with her all her life.

Don was a member of SCMA for at least 15 years and the SRRA for at least 6 years, judging from the pins he left behind.

Patricia, SCMA will be ever-grateful to you for your generosity. We promise to keep the pins and the vest in good keeping. Your dad's memory will remain renewed by his collection.

### Madawaska Four Corners Park Needs Your Help

Madawaska has a fundraiser underway to improve the Four Corners Park including acquiring the adjoining property. In October they received a \$10,000 challenge grant by the Charles Lamb Family Trust. The grant will match other contributions dollar for dollar. This means that other contributions will be doubled by the challenge grant dollars. Every dollar provided by other sources (such as SCMA members and USA Four Corners riders) is that much more powerful.

So far, the Madawaska Four Corners Park Association has raised \$7500 to match the grant. They are looking for another \$2500. That could be from people like you and me. If they meet this first \$10,000 challenge, then additional challenge rounds from the Lamb Family Trust totaling up to \$35,000 are possible. If matched, that will mean a grand total of

\$70,000 and the property acquisition and other improvements can move forward. A wonderful park becomes a greater park.

The park's treasurer has set up a special acquisition account. Please help them achieve the fund raising goal and expand the park. All donations in any amount will be truly helpful and appreciated.

If you have not yet been to Madawaska you are in for a treat. Joe LaChance reminds us that the park is all about the USA 4 Corners Tour.

### When Did the SCMA Start-up? What Is its Early History?

Some of us having been asking the question how SCMA got started and what the early history was like. Its hard to imagine that "ancient history" for this club starts years after many of us had graduated high school. Ancient history? You have got to be kidding! But, in fact, it has been to some degree. The "old timers" we have talked to started in the late 70s and early 80s. We know that the club started up in the late 60s. Ten years are missing.

During the Cemetery Tour registration in the lobby of the Best Western Crystal Palace, Steve Howe and Steve Shulman were approached by a woman who introduced herself as one of the early SCMA members. She is Marti Neumann, married to Harold Neumann. He was SCMA member #375 and one of the early secretaries.

Marti told us that the SCMA was formed in 1968 when members of their club were denied access to an AMA event. The men had ridden in on motorcycles and their families came by car or pickup. AMA wouldn't allow the non-motorcycle family members to enter the event. Be that way! said the group and SCMA was formed that year. The next year they formally chartered. Clubs in Southern

California formed SCMA. Back then clubs were large and very active. The Eagles, Loners, Nuggets and Never Readies were riding. Some of them were rough and tumble. Rides, rallies, campouts and jamborees were frequently conducted.

In 1974 talk about conducting the Three Flags Classic began. In 1976 the first Three Flags Classic was conducted. It began in Tijuana and ended in Vancouver. It was a straight ride up Interstate 5.

Back in those days SCMA was divided into Area A, Area B and Area C. Clubs within each area would meet together because of the logistical problem of the distances members had to travel to a general membership meeting serving the entire large geographic area covered by SCMA.

We are interested in hearing more. Marti gave us her email address. We will interview her and Harold soon and share more of the old days. If you have some history from the 60s and 70s we would love to hear from you. Help us learn about SCMA's past.

# Ride Safe: Maintaining a Safe Following Distance By Blake Anderson

A news item caught my eye a few weeks ago. Three riders were heading eastbound on OR 126 west of Redmond, Oregon. The lead bike braked for traffic and the trailing rider ran up on the second rider. Her front tire hit his rear tire and her bike bucked upwards very violently throwing her off the bike. Despite wearing a helmet she died at the scene from traumatic head injuries.

In mid-October you may have seen the TMZ video of the crash that occurred a few feet behind Leno during the 2011 Love Ride. An overtaking rider crashed into the rear of another rider. Too many bikes, too much speed and way too close. 2011 was also the year of the Love Ride fatality caused by the same thing during the ride to Castaic.

A decade ago, a riding friend of mine was on a six person group ride. The group was surprised by deer crossing the road, the lead bikes hit their brakes and a trailing rider destroyed the leg of the rider he was following. The rider bled out and died on the scene. Imagine THAT ride home.

These are stories told far too often. Stories that can be prevented. Following close looks cool and provides riders with a sense of unity and flow with the lead rider. But the risk is too great.

At 60 MPH, your front tire is spinning at 88 feet-persecond. If it comes in contact with the rear tire of the bike in front of you, the combined converging speed is 176 fps. Your violent upending is certain to occur. If your tire hits the lead rider's saddle bag it may tear it off in a split second and dump the lead bike (look at the Leno tape). Against the leg of another rider, it is likely to rip it clean off.

Short following distances and unsafe passing are the bane of group riding. Be it two riders or the Love Ride's 20,000 riders, the most significant safety measure anyone can take is to keep your distance. Staggered riding and a two second following distance are absolutely necessary to limit the likelihood (not prevent) a serious accident like I have just described.

Two seconds should be the absolute minimum safe following distance. Out on the open road (like riding the Three Flags Classic, for instance), why limit it to only 2 seconds? How about 4 or 5 seconds instead? When you travel the roads that make the TFC so enjoyable, don't you sometimes fix your gaze off to the side of the road for more than 2 seconds? How many times have you unintentionally run up next to a lead rider when he/ she slowed down for something on the road ahead? How many times have you been passed by your knuckle-headed riding buddy because he was looking off to the side as you slowed for traffic or to avoid an animal?

We have gotten away with it because of dumb luck. Only dumb luck.

So, I propose that everyone talk to your riding buddies about riding etiquette and riding safety before your next group ride. Consider the consequence of rear-ending one another. And then set a new agreement about following distance.

Remember the sound advice of Yosemite Sam.....

### VA 16 ("Back of the Dragon") Goes Big Time

What began as a passion for riding and a love for an amazing stretch of highway has turned into a tourism destination and one of the roads that on SCMA's Best 15 US Roads Challenge. A Virginia highway that rivals Tail of the Dragon is destined to become just as famous. It is now officially designated as the Back of the Dragon.

On October 22, Tazewell County Board of Supervisors Chairman, D. Michael Hymes, announced that the 32-mile stretch of Virginia State Route 16 between Tazewell County and Smyth County has been designated as "Back of the Dragon" by the State of Virginia. The Virginia Department of Transportation has produced "Back of the Dragon" signage that will be posted along the route.

Fifty local, regional and state officials and supporters gathered to mark the occasion and participate in a ribbon-cutting ceremony. The two counties worked together to promote a tourism asset with potential economic benefits to the region--not to mention riding thrills to motorcyclists like you and me.

The initiative began in 2010 when a local citizen named Larry Davidson had an idea. As an avid motorcyclist, Larry had ridden across the three mountains, 32 miles and 260 curves of VA 16 many times. He had also ridden the 11-mile Tail of the Dragon in North Carolina. The big difference between the two highways was not the challenge of the ride; it was the the marketing of the Tail. Based on that realization, Larry invented the idea of marketing VA 16 as the Back of the Dragon and he set to work.

Blake noticed the road's website in early 2011 and sent an email inquiry. Larry called him back a few minutes later. By the end of the conversation, Blake had decided to add it to his USA 4 Corners Tour after Larry offered a guided tour, a home cooked meal and a night's rest in his home near the west end of the route. As a result of that riding experience, Blake added the Back of the Dragon to the 2012 edition of SCMA's Best 15 US Roads Challenge. Its one bitchin' road. Where the Tail is down in a creek bottom and mostly in shadow and closed-in, the Back is open ridge line and hill top riding.

Meanwhile, with Larry's unrelenting promotional acumen, the enthusiastic support of the local towns and business community and the bscking of the Virginia legislature, the designation of VA 16 as Back of the Dragon was inevitable.

What impresses SCMA is how one guy very much like you and me can marshall two communities and make a difference. The success of the Back of the Dragon concept demonstrates how an individual can convert an idea into a real thing that is a significant economic asset for the people living there.

Ron Thomason, Smyth County Tourism Director, stated that the Town of Marion (on the east end) is already seeing the results of marketing Route 16 as Back of the Dragon at their local restaurants. Motorcyclists and motorists are seeking the BOTD for its challenges and beauty.

Larry says it has been a team effort from day one and will continue to be so. In the last year they have seen riders and drivers from all over the United States and several foreign countries enjoy the 32 miles now called the Back of the Dragon.

For those of us in SCMA that will eventually arrive in Tazewell and Marion to ride the BOTD, have a meal and perhaps find overnight lodging, all we can say is hurray to Larry. You have given us one more reason to love long distance riding. We will see you on the road.
