TFC updates are there. Also, go to the Three Flags Classic Forum and look around there. Steve Shulman's TFC checklist is there

But motorcycle trouble will cause you fits. Shops are thin on our route and nothing will be open on Sunday and Monday. 

Our annual SCMA Grand Tour is set for October 12, 13 and 14. The entry fee is \$25. Sign-in is 6am to 7:30am at the Denny's Restaurant, 16262 Sierra Highway, Mojave, CA. Our checkpoint and overnight lodging will be the Best Western, Town and Country located at 189 N. Main Street, Cedar City, Utah. Our finish will be on October 13 in Laughlin, Nevada.

We will leave Mojave and head easterly toward Death Valley. We will travel through the park, head out





the east side and point ourselves in the direction of Las Vegas. From there







The 2013 Turkey Run, Saturday, November 16 By Ronald "Gonzo" Gonzalez

The November Turkey will fly south to San Diego County on November 16 hoping to find warmer and drier weather for his annual SCMA Turkey Run.



This one day ride is planned to begin at Bravo Burgers in San Juan Capistrano and run about 150 miles through the Cleveland National Forest, skirting Lake Elsinore, Menifee

Valley, Temecula Wine Country and Pala communities and ride the vista-friendly North San Diego Hill Country. It ends at the Pala Casino.

To establish a promising afternoon, a poker chip drawing will be held at the Pala Casino and every participant will have the opportunity to extract a chip of either \$1, \$2, \$5, \$25 or \$50

value. The drawing will be held in the Pala Casino Spa & Resort's Food Court before lunch when riders arrive.

We made this ride a Saturday so that riders can make it a weekend outing by reserving a room at the Pala Hotel. Try the casino, attend a concert, and



enjoy an evening's dinner. Group rates for SCMA will be available if more than 10 rooms are reserved.



Before returning home, riders can continue south and visit local areas of interest such as Palomar Observatory (via S6, a tight-twisting road, climbing 2500' in 7 miles), Julian for apple pie, or continue an hour's ride south to local attractions in San Diego and

spend a night there. The possibilities are nearly endless.

November's Turkey Run will be a great opportunity to ride new roads and enjoy a fun weekend with friends and significant others! So make your plans now and block out the weekend of the 16th. This is a ride designed for a two-up weekend.

AZRATPack 101: An Intro to the Club and an End of Summer Update By Victor Castaneda Jr. "El Presidente" and Rodney Chew "El Chino Loco"

For those of you unfamiliar with our club, we are the Arizona Riders Association of Triumph, formed at the turn of the current century by the now defunct Phoenix International Motorsports. Despite the coming and going of dealer sponsors, internal politics and the tough economic times that have caused numerous members to move away, we are currently in the midst of a renaissance with increasing participation. Go AZ Motorcycles is our new dealer sponsor and we are the first affiliated SCMA club outside of California. We can attribute our success to a few different key points:

A strong social media presence

Everyone likes to get their news and updates differently these days, along with a traditional website/forum, we use Meetup.com, Twitter, Google +, a Facebook Page and discussion group.

Using social media, we also encourage our members to participate beyond just showing up to a ride or dinner by contributing to our gallery page via using a special hashtag on Instagram. Their photos show up on the website almost immediately. Our YouTube Channel and various photo albums are used to show members having a good time at our events. Nothing increases participation better than photos and videos of people smiling and enjoying themselves!

Our "Everyone Is Welcome" policy

As a Triumph owners club, we feel that a major part of our job is to spread enthusiasm for the brand we love. AND we encourage people with other brands of bikes to participate in our events. Hopefully, we will make you a "convert".

All levels of riders are welcome

We pace our rides moderately, making it friendly to everyone. New riders and people returning to the sport are the future of our club. No need to alienate them by zooming off and leaving them behind. They joined the club in order to ride and socialize with people, not to be reminded that their skills and habits are not up to snuff. Our members always offer respectful tips to new and returning riders to help fuel their enthusiasm instead of smothering it.

No dues, no politics

We are one of the few clubs that don't charge dues. Our dealer sponsor pays to keep the lights on. When you charge people money for something, they expect something in return. When their expectations aren't met, it causes big problems. We try to keep things light and fairly informal so that everyone is comfortable and can focus on the important stuff: riding and benchracing!

A Recap of 2013-so far.

During 2013 the AZRATPack has had a number of successful social events including regular dinners and breakfasts at a variety of Food



Network recognized restaurants around the Phoenix area. We also ran three successful ride events: the annual Sedona Ride, the British Invasion Party/Southern Arizona Tour and the First Annual Desert to Sea Ride.

An Introduction to the AZRATPack (Continued from previous page)

<u>The Sedona Ride</u>, a four hundred mile loop took over 20 riders through the foothills of the Mogollon Basin to Lake Mary road across to Flagstaff and down to the town of Sedona where we had lunch at the airport. Sedona being a little more than halfway, meant an afternoon return to home via some of Arizona's most popular scenic



and twisty roads. Our dealer sponsor, Go AZ Motorcycles of Scottsdale, provided a chase vehicle in case of any unforeseen troubles.

The British Invasion Party/ Southern Arizona Tour celebrated the restoration

of a genuine RAF Shackelton Aircraft at the Pima Air and Space Museum east of Tucson. The club made this an overnight ride in the quaint old mining town of Bisbee, AZ. A group of 25 rode from Scottsdale, AZ down to the museum in the morning and meet up with a contingent of riders from Tucson and neighboring communities.

The bikes were given free entrance to the museum. British bikes were allowed to enter on the grounds and ride up to the British planes, that included RAF Spitfires and other WWII-era planes for photo opportunities and tours. Some other highlights included a Lockheed SR71 display.

After our museum stop, we headed up the twisty roads of Mount Lemmon where we stopped for lunch near the peak. Bisbee looks like 1940s San Francisco with buildings built right up the side of the canyon in which the town sits. Many hotel, bars and restaurants maintain the original architecture and flavor of the town. The town has a 3000+ step stairwell traversing up one side of

the town. The next day was a trip back to the Phoenix area via Mount Graham and Safford.

The First Annual Desert to Sea Ride was another success with twenty plus riders riding from Go AZ Motorcycles to San Diego. This was expected to be a challenging ride through the heat for many of the riders. The shop was kind enough to provide a chase vehicle in case of problems encountered on the road. The route took us along the Mexican border through Calexico and eventually west to Otay Lake Rd and into San Diego via Coronado island. The General Manager of Go AZ flew into San Diego to greet all the people at the end and treated us all to dinner at Dick's Last Resort in the Gas Lamp District. The next day the group headed back to Phoenix after breakfast via Borrego and the Salton Sea, eventually connecting to Interstate 10 near Blythe. Both days were hot with desert temps above 115 degrees.

We ride with SCMA

Five AZRATPack members will be participating in the SCMA's Three Flags Classic on Labor Day and in October we will have our Annual Route 66 Tour, starting in Scottsdale, leading through Winslow, Williams, Ash Fork, Kingman and Oatman.

Many AZRATPack members will be following the 3 Flags riders from the club on a Spot Locator and watching Victor and Rodney progress



on the ride. We expect a large number of Calif Parks and Mission tour participants next year as
