The 2013 offering was a great experience. Well run checkpoints, terrific merchandise (don't you love the hat?), and a challenging route. All of that was the good news.

But we had five accidents as well. Four caused minor injuries. The very bad news is there was one fatality. Robert Farr, 70, an experienced long distance rider and a frequent TFC rider was riding by himself when he failed to negotiate a sharp turn a few miles north of the Delta checkpoint. He received fatal injuries as he tumbled down the slope. SCMA is very sad to hear this news and conveys our deepest sympathy to Robert's family

The Madawaska Dream Continues to Improve by Blake P. Anderson

If you have been on the USA Four Corners Tour in the last several years, then you have probably visited the only local park dedicated to long distance riding. The vision and unrelenting hard work of Joe Lachance and his gang of Acadians has transformed a weed-filled knobby empty lot into a beautiful park that overlooks Madawaska's main street (US Highway 1) and Canada in the distance. This is a large fountain, shade, benches, well-kept grounds and monuments. Underfoot along the walkways are pavers dedicated to our Four Corner riders, other motorcyclists, and local people, businesses and memorable events.

It is community park with a huge national importance. There is nothing else like it.

Last year the old house next door became available. With the help of a large donation from Charles Lamb (our riding chum from Virginia who is attempting to ride the USA Four Corners in all months during the next few years) and other local and national contributions, the Madawaska Park

Foundation bought the property, razed the house and have developed it--doubling the size of the park and providing much-needed parking.

One of their next projects is to build a dramatic arch way over the entrance to the park. An artist"s



rendition of the concept is shown here. When this is completed and the foliage has had time to grow, the park will have a very permanent and substantial look.




SCMA Grand Tour October 12-14



The November Turkey will fly south to San Diego County on November 16 hoping to find warmer and drier weather for his annual SCMA Turkey Run.



This one day ride begins at Bravo Burgers in San Juan Capistrano and runs about 150 miles through the Cleveland National Forest, skirting Lake Elsinore, Menifee Valley,

Temecula Wine Country, Pala, and the vista-filled North San Diego Hill Country. It ends at the Pala Casino.

To establish a promising afternoon, a poker chip drawing will be held at the Pala Casino and every participant will have the opportunity to extract a chip of either \$1, \$2, \$5, \$25 or \$50 value. The drawing will be held in the Pala Food Court before lunch when riders arrive.

We made this ride a Saturday so that riders can make it a weekend outing by reserving a room at the Pala Hotel. Try the casino, attend a concert, and enjoy dinner. Group rates for SCMA will be available if more than 10 rooms are reserved.



Before returning home, riders can continue south and visit local



areas of interest such as Palomar Observatory (via S6, a tight-twisting road, climbing 2500' in 7 miles), Julian for apple pie, or continue an hour's ride south to local attractions in San Diego and spend a night there. The possibilities are nearly endless.

After Action Report— 2013 Three Flags Classic Rally By Trash and Olde Skool the Trike

Once again your road raconteur, Trash and his Goldwing trike, Olde Skool, have ventured on a long road trip. This time it was as a solo rider on the 38th annual

Southern California Motorcycle Association's (SCMA) Three Flags Classic Tour. The temps were

mostly in 70's and 80's



and only some rain. My rally mileage from Deming, NM to Winnipeg, Canada was 2,028 miles in four days. Ride odometer mileage was 4,778 miles (August 27-September 8).

Days 1-3 - Las Vegas to Deming, NM

I was plagued with a left ear infection (discovered the day before I left and got prescription meds) and right leg sciatic nerve problem the whole trip.

I knew that with my medical issues, I would not be trying the 4-Corners ride after the 3-Flags rally. I just hoped that I could finish the 3-Flags rally. It would be a battle to do that. I had paid for the rally and wanted to at least try. Anyway no one has ever accused me of being the sharpest knife in the drawer or the sharpest pencil in the box.

Day 4: The first leg was to Delta, CO – 575 miles.

I left at around 4 AM from Deming, NM. The

ride through the Rockies and the

the "Switzerland of America" was amazing out of Durango, CO. I have a white trike, but when



I arrived in Delta, CO (first checkpoint stop – 575 miles) it was covered in bugs. Someone

asked me if I had missed any out there. The trike looked two-toned, but I was just too tired to clean anything but the windshield. At the motel a rally senior volunteer



lady had to walk across the motel parking lot to get a new room key for me, since mine did not work. I was just too tired to do even that even after eating at the motel restaurant.

Day 5: The second rally day was to Chadron, NE – 570 miles.

I decided to take a break and ate at the Log Cabin Café just off I70 in Frisco, CO. It is a very nice place to eat. Riding through northern Nebraska a large coal trail was traveling in the opposite direction on my right. As it approached I pressed the Goldwing's horn and raised my fist straight in the air. The return blast from the train was of biblical portions --- it is one of the great moments on the road

Day 6: The third rally day was to Bismarck, ND – 468 miles.

This was very interesting as I had just been to the Sturgis Rally a few weeks before. And now here I am again only a few miles from where I was as I passed by Rapid City, SD. I turned



east and bisected SD as I headed north

through open country. I was really out there by myself. I actually did see a few other non-rally riders on big Harleys. You choose your own rally route, but there is a suggested route each year.

Day Seven: The last leg Bismarck ND to Winnipeg, Canada – 415 miles.

I stopped at the Trinity Hospital in Minot, ND for several hours for left ear treatment. I wanted a doctor to look at it. Afterwards, I headed across the border and east toward Winnipeg. I arrived at 6 PM local to the hotel rally table, but had until

9 PM to qualify as a finisher. I was one happy rider to be done. Now I will no longer be under the clock when I ride home.



Day Eight: A down day in Winnipeg

The wonderful banquet was the next night and I was just able to attend and eat. I kept wiping sweat off my neck and forehead. Then I immediately left and went back to my hotel to rest. So here I am – in a foreign country, sick, alone.

thousands of miles from home, and on a motorcycle trike. Nice. Real nice. But I knew I had an ace up my sleeve -- the Big Wing.



Days 9-13 – Winnipeg, Canada to Las Vegas, NV

I used my GPS to find the highway south out of Winnipeg and traveled steadily south to Fargo, SD where I would turn due west on Interstate 94. My goal was Montana as my ride would bisect North Dakota. I ended up in Glendive, MT or 604 miles.

As I turned due west at Fargo, ND I knew it was time. My hand pulled the throttle back and my right thumb activated the cruise control and then the set button. I put Olde Skool in Battle Attack mode (no quarter asked, no quarter given – a fight to the death) and the miles started to rapidly disappear under my wheels.

The big 1800cc liquid cooled engine was destroying everything in front of it with silent unrelenting power.

The next day I did the same thing and rode 557 miles to



Idaho Falls, ID. I decided I needed to rest an extra day before riding the 518 miles to St. George, UT. The rest day was well needed. Interestingly, I found on the road that I really liked the individual pizzas or the Subway 6-inch hot tuna/cheese sandwiches. I grab the food at a gas stop and ate as I rode. I usually ate lunch around 10-12 noon as I had breakfast at the motel and was on the road by 6:30AM.


Reflecting on the experience.

This was a great rally ride. It was very well organized with over 200 riders. Too bad I was under the weather the whole time. Everyone at the rally and motels seemed to like my trike set up and décor even with some bugs. I did do some minor cleaning on the trip when I felt like I had the energy. Next year the 3-Flags Rally starts in Tucson, AZ to Harrison Hot Springs, British Columbia, Canada. I might ride it again if I am healthy. The country I saw was outstanding.





Ride Safe: ATGATT By Blake P. Anderson

ATGATT or "All the gear, all the time" is a common sense approach that most SCMA riders follow. Watching the 210 riders that geared-up and left Deming during the start of the 2013 Three Flags Classic would certainly convince most observers of that.



Armored gloves and boots. Full face helmets. The best riding gear: Aerostich, Motoport, Tourmaster, Olympia, Joe Rocket, Scorpion and others was in evidence.

Modern textile, leather and mesh materials were there. Hi-Viz is becoming more popular and boy do those jackets stand out in a crowd. In short, the veteran long distance motorcyclists that populate SCMA rides take riding seriously. Beanie helmets, half-gloves, bare arms and denim jackets are rarely seen. No flip flops here.

Why is that?

Well, this year's accidents on the Three Flags are reason enough. Robert Farr's fatality couldn't be avoided because of the severity of the situation--an over-the-cliff accident--but the other accidents are another story. The riders

involved in the two rolled bikes and the deer strike walked away with bumps and bruises but no road rash and no serious injuries. They were standing, chatting and working on getting their bikes rescued within moments of their crashes. A bit relieved that they were virtually unhurt gave them the ability to move



forward in problem-solving mode immediately

after the crash. Certainly, that's an outcome we all pray for.

Ignoring ATGATT when you ride is simply self-

delusion. One day we all go down. The recovery is far less complicated when we keep our skin, bones, teeth and



As far as I can recall, SCMA has

skull intact.

never had an argument with a rider who insisted on not wearing a helmet. Isn't that interesting when you consider the huge fights that have occurred for "rider's rights" in states that have recently withdrawn long-standing helmet laws?

I think this is testimony to the professionalism of our riders. God knows we have some very unconventional people in our midst. But are they reckless? Not so much. That's probably the reason we see riders in their 70s and 80s completing the ride year after year.



Notwithstanding the mayhem of 2013, SCMA's long term safety record is amazing. That is because our no nonsense riders take the challenge of long distance riding very seriously. Collectively, they plan smart, dress smart and ride smart. It is what allows us to enjoy millions of miles of riding and live to tell about it.

ATGATT is one more reason we proudly call ourselves long distance motorcyclists.

On Sunday October 27, we will check in at the Old Susana Café, 1555 Kuehner Drive in Simi Valley between 7:00 and 8:00am, and then get on the road to checkout folks who have checked out. The Café offers good food and generous portions, so we suggest you arrive hungry.

The ride meanders for 190 miles through Simi, Ojai, and Tejon Pass, coming to a close at a lone grave on Woodford Tehachapi Road. We will stop to rest, visit, and find the answers to several questions at eight cemeteries along the way. Among our hosts this day are: a couple of somewhat prominent Californians, a school teacher, some fallen soldiers, and a fellow motorcyclist. They all wait patiently and silently for our visit.

The ride fee is 10 bucks per head and includes ride pins and/or year bars for the visitors.

Join the fun by purchasing a full color, well-illustrated passport book from SCMA that lists all locations. Get a park stamp and a photo of yourself at each location. Return the completed passport to SCMA and get it back along with a pin and a plaque.

CMT During any single calendar year and in any order and at any pace, visit all of the 21 California Missions. It works just like the CPA listed above

During 2013, travel our annual list of Best 15 US Roads. Every mile from your home to the roads and back again must be traveled on a motorcycle, trike or sidecar. Rules, application and details can be found on our website.
