California Adventure Series

March is here and riders have been signing up at a steady pace for the 2019 California Adventure Series. We have riders from Canada, Virginia, Colorado, Oregon, and California already riding around the state.

Please send in your notarized Release of Liability (ROL) as soon as possible after signing up for your ride and then I will send you your tour book. The Adventure Series ROL is available on the SCMA website with the corresponding Adventure Series ride. Only one ROL is required for the Adventure Series ride, you do not need to send in a ROL for each Adventure ride. Note the address change on the website for the California Adventure Series. For riders in Canada, I was advised by the post office that it takes about two weeks for the books to arrive after mailing.

Charlie Lamb rode out from Virginia to attend the SCMA Awards Banquet on March 2 in Irvine. Charlie signed up for all three California Adventure rides and plans on earning the

"California Triple Crown" award again. I gave him his tour books at the banquet and received an email from him today, March 5, saying he has already completed nine parks and eight missions. Charlie is also experiencing a California anomaly, RAIN, and lots of it. Safe riding Charlie!

A couple weeks ago, we had a break in the rain and I took a ride up to Santa Barbara and Ventura, visiting three missions and two parks. After visiting the Channel Islands visitor center in Ventura, I located the "Fishermen's Memorial" in





the nearby harbor. The four fishermen sculpted on the memorial are casts of real life fishermen from the era the memorial was sculpted.

One of the "California Best 15 Roads", Highway 243, is closed due to major damage from the recent rains. There is no time estimate from Cal-trans as to when the road will be repaired. If you are on your tour, you can get a receipt in Banning and take a photo in front of the "road closed" sign.

We are actively researching additional rides to incorporate into the California Adventure Series. We will continue with three rides, but beginning in 2020, we will put one of the current rides on "layaway" for a time and offer a new ride. This will provide our Adventure Series riders who ride year after year, the opportunity to ride to some new locations.

As you ride around the state on your Adventure Series, send me an occasional email and photo highlighting your adventure and I will publish it in the SCMA newsletter. Send emails to adventures@sc-ma.com



Ride Committee

Rodney Chew #24784 Vice Chairman

At the start of 2019 the SCMA decided to create a Rides Committee. The goal of the committee is to organize rides for the SCMA and promote affiliates.

The committee will have oversight of the SCMA Premiere rides and local/regional rides sponsored by the SCMA. The Rides Committee is chaired by Rodney Chew (Vice Chair SCMA and AZRATPACK Risk Manager) with Les Gullery (SCMA, Shamrocks); members include Karen Butterfield (SCMA, Red Hot Riders), Mike Williams (CA Adventure Series Chair), and a few more member volunteers interested in local riding; they will be charged with creating and managing SCMA labeled rides. The committee will be charged with evaluating marketing, ride re-fresh (routes and destinations) and special events. I will announce now that the SCMA will only sponsor TWO rides in calendar 2019. This marks the end of the Travelers Awards program and awards. For those that have been a part of the Travelers challenge I say we appreciate all your support for the series

The SCMA has determined its prime focus is LONG DISTANCE rides. The nature of the SCMA's rides identifies long distance riding as a focus. The two rides will stay focused to LONG DISTANCE goals or challenges for which are welcome. One of the rides will be an overnight the other a local SoCal day ride (long day ride). More info will be presented on this later.

At the same time the SCMA recognizes that many of the affiliate club members have ridden, or will ride, some SCMA events and become SCMA members. We want to promote local riding (Southern California, Southwest Region) and people of various clubs meeting up for events.

2019 Ride schedule:

The SCMA ride program is taking a drastic change for 2019. The Travelers award program became a difficult program to administer. The shear number of rides was difficult to administer, rider participation due to logistics and cost became strained and, from an organizational and tracking perspective, it was a difficult administrative task for the SCMA.

I want to thank all the affiliates that worked with us on the Travelers award rides and numerous other ride events in the past years. I know it took effort for the affiliated clubs members to put on a show.

As announced earlier the SCMA will sponsor two rides in calendar 2019 - these rides will soon be developed by members of the Ride Committee. The committee welcomes participants from the affiliates who would like to assist us. The goal is to create either two, or a series of fun rides, the SCMA can brand and repeat every year.

SCMA affiliates clubs are encouraged to promote their rides on the SCMA website and via E-Blasts. We know a lot of us just like to hang out together and ride with the other clubs. Affiliate clubs promote their knowledge of local regions and culture to provide interesting

and rewarding rides for all varieties of riders and equipment.

Club schedules will be published as requested in the SCMA newsletter and on the SCMA website and calendar. Riders in various regions can find out what affiliates are doing and decide what interests them the most. (This will be repeated)

How will you get information? I need for you to be patient as we overhaul the SCMA website. The goal is to make it a more informative and interactive website for CLUBS and all riders. Evaluations are being performed with a professional media organization that works with organization like the San Diego Chargers and the Padres baseball organization as well as other motorcycle related entities. It may sound silly but we want our website to appear when people web search "motorcycle rides" when in the Southwest.

We will continue promoting the SCMA Premiere Ride Series, USA 4 Corners, 15 Best USA Roads, Three Flags Classic and California Adventure Series. Many changes will be made to these rides to bring new experiences to some of the classic SCMA rides. Look for many new variations in the challenge, different destinations and goals in the rides. In the short term the California Adventure series will now promote numerous challenges in California. Many ideas have been tabled to add new CA ADV RIDES and let other rides take a rest for a period of time. The addition of the CA ADV SERIES CA 15 Best Roads is an excellent new ride. In its second year a rider will never repeat a road for up to four years worth of interesting roads. Come out and join the fun. New rides may include CA Wineries, Lighthouses, Ghost Towns......you get the idea.....many new challenges are being evaluated for upcoming ride seasons.

Additionally, all rides will be evaluated for redundancy of objectives and difficulties that expose participants to unnecessary financial challenges to complete the ride. Look for a number of changes in newsletter and the website in the future. Changes to the rides may come mid-season but all completed objectives will always count toward a finish.

A short comment, the Shamrocks St Patricks ride was held in early March. The turnout was GREAT!! A great route planned by Dennis Even and Les Gullery took us from Ventura, CA to Monterrey, CA on the PCH (CA-1) The weather was fabulous, scenery was excellent, and fun was had by all.

Seeing the turnout for the ride and the variety of people and clubs that were there was encouraging sign that SCMA and affiliates can put on some very good and fun events! We have the riders....now we need to present fun rides that will attract those riders.

Shamrock St Patrick's Day Ride

For us at the AZRATPACK we kicked off our riding season in Phoenix in January with our West Valley Tour. As soon as it was announced there was quite a bit of excitement to hear there would be Shamrocks Saint Patrick's Day Ride in SoCal. Many of us have fond memories of the last Shamrocks St Pats passing through Death Valley.

As the ride got closer it was revealed that the ride would be a grand trip northward on the Pacific Coast Hwy, always a wonderful journey and a return south bound back to San Simeon. The PCH was open again! Time to go see an all time favorite road again.

In the weeks leading up to the ride the west coast, SoCal and Arizona experienced some extremely WET and COLD weather. Was this trip gonna be a rained out? Fogged in? It generated quite some concern, but our group would slug it out no-matter what, we have 3G - Gear, Guts and Glory (LOL). We would ride out a day ahead of the ride from Phoenix to Ventura. For this trip a favorite RP rider Chuck Erricson was able to make the trip. He rides a Kawasaki 650 KLR, the rest of us were on 800s and 1000cc bikes. In total four of us made the trip (Rodney Chew, Steve Stoops, Chuck Ericson and Degame Dominguez)

The KLR and 800s was a group of three. We got on the road at 6am Friday and the temps in the desert were in the 30s. Brrr. We stayed off the interstates a much as possible, taking us westward through Parker, AZ, Twenty Nine Palms, CA through Apple Valley and eventually through Santa Clarita to 126 to Ventura. Weather heading westward was COLD, COLD and I was concerned this entire trip would be COLD. It did not warm up till Santa Clarita. We welcomed the warming conditions and also some added riding partners, John and Candice Hartley. After brief lunch the Arizonians got right into the swing of CA lane splitting. Yee-haw, nerves of Steel, OMG, LOL.

Arriving in Ventura we were staying in Ventura Harbor at a VERY comfortable Sheraton Four Points. SCORE !!!!!! After a nice seafood dinner we crashed.

Saturday AM the weather was PERFECT. We headed to registration at the local Mimi's restaurant. We all checked in and had a very nice breakfast. There was a fun group of



riders from some of the SCMA affiliates. In all 22 riders checked in for the ride.

Rolling out of Ventura the temps were great adding to the enjoyment of the flower covered hills (The California Super Bloom). Our route was 101 North to Santa Barbara, 154 to Los Olivos, then 101 to San Luis Obispo (SLO). It was very satisfying to see Lake Cachuma WITH WATER IN IT. The drought had really been hard on this Lake. It was worth a stop at the Lake overlook for a look and a bathroom break!

Next stop the coast. Morro Bay, Cayucos,

missed it. We travelled to the Michelle Pfeiffer State Park, pulled out and decided our northward journey was over.

We headed back to the N-F road. Parked for a while and took pictures....such a gorgeous day! Only one more requested stop. Seal beach. Heading south in the afternoon went well. Traffic was much lighter and the twisty CA-1 seemed to be more fun.. Seal Beach arrived and we took time to view the seals. Now we are just a short hop to the finish in San Simeon. Time to get off the bike and relax at the San Simeon Lodge. We sat at the outdoor tables totally amazed at the warm temps and talking good stories of the day's riding. Dinnertime came and the Shamrocks had a big table assembled for all of us. The menu was full of nice meal selections.....plenty of "bike and trip" stories for everyone.

California Best 15 Roads

SCMA's CA Adventure Series, a long time favorite amongst the Southwest Region riders and our International and National riders pursuing the Triple Crown, is about to become an even bigger favorite.

Dennis Even, longtime SCMA member, former SCMA Treasurer, former Chair, CA Adventure Series, and recipient of the Legacy Award, has developed the CA Best 15 roads to ride while you're out visiting Parks and Missions. The Board of Directors reviewed and approved the overall concept and approved this second set of books listing the 2019 CA Best 15 Roads.

The concept Dennis and Les Gullery (Shamrock Road Riders) developed consists of 60 fantastic roads in CA broken down to 20 in the North, 20 in the Central, and 20 in the South of California. From that inventory of 60, 15 roads will be selected consisting of 5 each from the North, Central and South areas, to be offered over a four-year period. In years 2018, 2019, 2020, and 2021 a different set of 5 will be selected from the inventory so that at the end of a four-year period riders will have ridden all 60 of these fantastic highways.

In addition to expanding the CA Adventure Series, a new award titled the CA Triple Crown will be awarded to riders completing the complete series. This award will be similar to the Triple Crown awarded to finishers of three of premier rides.

Below is the 2019 list of CA Best 15 CA Roads you can ride while visiting various parks and missions within California: This is the 2^{nd} of 4 sets of 15 CA Best Roads.

All roads can be ridden in either direction, be sure to obtain your gas or store receipt and write your mileage for the start and for the finish.

Sign up now to ride these great roads in 2019....combine your ride with the Parks and Missions and earn the beautiful California Triple Crown.

California Triple Crown

We have a new challenge for SCMA members.

A challenge that is completely doable, within reach of everyone, especially members in the southwest region or within a few states close to California.

With the introduction of the California Best 15 Roads, SCMA now has 3 rides with destinations that are often co-located with each other.

The Board of Directors came up with the idea of recognizing those riders who successfully complete the full CA Adventure Series in one calendar year between January 1st and November 30th.

We are in the process of designing this award and expect it to be very similar to the SCMA Triple Crown, but will be a slightly different.

The **CA Triple Crown** will join the ranks of the other major awards designed to recognize riders that accomplish riding a significant distance in the calendar year.

Those awards are the **Triple Crown** award for riding three of the premier events, and the **Premier Grand Slam** for riding all six premier events in a single calendar year.

The **California Triple Crown** is defined as completing the full California Adventure Series in one calendar year. There is one year of eligibility, defined as the year a rider registers for the event, to complete the series and qualify for the California Triple Crown

Be one of the few of the SCMA riders to receive this CA Triple Crown and sign up now!!

In odd-numbered years the Chairman, Membership Director and Risk Manager are elected. The location for the Annual Member's Meeting, will be held at:

Positions open for nominations in the mid-year elections for 2019 are:

Chairman – The chair shall be the principal executive officer of the corporation and shall in general supervise and control all of the business and affairs of the corporation. He shall preside at all meetings of the board of directors. In the event of a tie vote at a meeting of the board of directors on any issue that may be decided by a simple majority of the board of directors, the vote of the chair shall be preponderant. The chair shall perform all duties incident to the office of chair and such other duties as from time to time shall be prescribed by the board of directors.

Secretary – The secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the board of directors in one or more books, and/or digital records, provided for that purpose; see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these bylaws, or as required by law, and in general perform all duties incident to the office of secretary.

Risk Manager – The risk manager is responsible for obtaining sanctions and insurance for all rides and annual officer and director insurance. The risk manager shall assist SCMA chartered clubs in judging competition as requested and shall act as arbitrator in any dispute pertaining to competition in all SCMA events, and perform such other duties and the board may from time to time determine.

NOMINATIONS_are now open until the Annual Meeting scheduled for April 27th at 12:00 noon. Any current SCMA member can nominate any other

current SCMA member. Self-nominations are acceptable but require three seconds at the Annual Meeting.

Only paper ballots are acceptable for the election and must be received at the Post Office Box by 8:00 am June XXth.

The ballots will be opened and counted in public at the June 16th General Membership Meeting (GMM) by the Election Committee, observed by member witnesses, and supervised by the Chair of the Election Committee. The newly elected officers will be announced at the meeting, posted to the website, and posted in the June/July Newsletter.

The newly elected Directors will assume their responsibilities after the close of the June 16th Board meeting and no later than July 1st 2019.



Status Report (eBlast #4) on 3FC19 Hotels at Start and Finish

It is now April, and 4.5 months or so to the final push of getting all our gear in place for the check-in process in San Luis Rio Colorado (SLRC). Despite a few challenges, the 3FC19 Committee continues moving forward in getting all details finalized.

Let's go over some of the details"

- 1. Start and finish locations finalized SLRC Sonora Mexico and Vernon BC Canada. Item #7 below addresses hotel reservations.
- 2. Route and checkpoint were determined. However, a pre-ride recently completed by Paul Lax identified some issues with day 1 routing. Paul and Steve Andrus are redesigning that portion of the route. As soon as that is completed we will release a turn by turn for all.
- 3. Physical location of each checkpoint will soon be identified. Once Paul has the route completed he will begin making arrangements for check-in locations within the checkpoint cities.
- 4. A logo design has been completed but is awaiting the final mileage pending Steve and Paul's final route design. This logo is being shopped to the buckle manufacturer for initial consideration to start the buckle design.
- 5. The committee is considering some pin and patch designs as an alternative to the designed logo. Hat and t-shirt designs are now in progress.
- 6. The big challenge has been with arranging start and finish hotels; we're please to announce that arrangements are completed.
- 7. Hotel Araiza has an English speaking staff to take reservations via telephone. Hotel San Angel has part-time English-speaking staff. As soon as a final decision is made, and approval received from the Board of Directors, an eBlast shall be released to inform you of the changes.




