Judge Joseph Mandeville

On October 17th we lost a great friend, civic leader, and long time SCMA leader/supporter and avid motorcyclist.

Joe was born in Spearville, Kansas and is survived by his wife Elaine (nee Swiderski), son Joseph M. Mandeville, daughter Suzanne Jones, granddaughter Kristina Jones and grandson Blake Jones.

He was a Chairman of the SCMA for 2 terms (4 years) in 1998, 1999, 2000, and 2001. In addition to serving many years on Three Flags Committees, he was a six-time Chairman of the Three Flags Classic in 1984, 1987, 1995, 1996, 2004, and 2011.

Joe was a 7-time finisher of SCMA's USA Four Corners Tour in 1984, 1987, 1988, 1989, 2005, 2008, and 2009 and was awarded BMW's 1,000,000 mile Certificate. Joe also was a member of the Pasadena Motorcycle Club, the Shamrock Road Riders and the Iron Butt Association.



Joe served honorably in Vietnam as a Navy Corpsman assigned to the US Marines, and in 1967 received the Navy Commendation Medal with a "V" device for valor. He earned a BS from Kansas State University, a Juris Doctor from Western University School of Law, and an MBA from California State University. After many years in private practice, Joe was



appointed to the bench in 1990 and served until his retirement in 2010.

His love of adventure also led him to obtain his private pilots license in 1999. In his free time he would fly his family to their vacation homes in Palm Springs and Las Vegas. Joe was also proud of his collection of classic cars, especially his '69 and a half Plymouth Dayton Orange Roadrunner.

Joe was bigger than life but despite his vast achievements, Joe remained a simple, humble and kind man.

Elaine, Joseph, Suzanne, Kristina and Blake, on behalf of the members of Southern California Motorcycling Association, we share your loss and sorrow, we are thankful to have benefited from Joe's leadership, and we extend our deepest sympathies.

Dennis Even, longtime SCMA member, former SCMA Treasurer, former Chair, CA Adventure Series, and recipient of the Legacy Award, has developed the CA Best 15 roads to ride while you're out visiting Parks and Missions. The Board of Directors reviewed and approved the overall concept and approved this second set of books listing the 2019 CA Best 15 Roads.

California Triple Crown

We will continue this challenge in 2020 for SCMA members.

This challenge is completely doable, within reach of everyone, especially members in the southwest region or those states close to California.

With the introduction of the California Best 15 Roads, SCMA now has 3 rides with destinations that are often co-located with each other.

The Board of Directors came up with the idea of recognizing those riders who successfully complete the full CA Adventure Series in one calendar year

between January 15th and November 30th.

The **CA Triple Crown** will join the ranks of the other major awards designed to recognize riders that accomplish riding a significant distance in the calendar year.

Those awards are the **Triple Crown** award for riding three of the premier events, and the **Premier Grand Slam** for riding all six premier events in a single calendar year.

The **California Triple Crown** is defined as completing the full California Adventure Series in one calendar

year. There is one year of eligibility, and is defined as the year in which the rider registers for the event. The rider must then complete the series before Nov 30th of that year of registration.

Be one of the few of the SCMA riders to receive this CA Triple Crown and sign up now!!







This difficult Premier Ride Challenge is offered again with some interesting changes for its ninth year, 2019. Six replacement roads or road groups, plus a Sixteenth road have been added to the list. A challenge taker may ride any 15 of the 16 listed roads to qualify as a finisher. But, this ride challenge is not for everyone... to date, only 30 riders have been able to complete the Best 15 US Roads Challenge. There have been 41 finishes as some of these long distance riders have gone around more than once over the years. Do you have what it takes to join this very limited group of SCMA long distance riders?

As a registrant, you will have a two-year window to complete the challenge one time, though ALL 15 Roads must be ridden in ONE calendar year. If, for any reason, you do not complete all roads the first year, you will have a second chance, BUT, you start with a blank slate for that second try.

2019 Three Flags Classic

A lot of excitement leading up to 3FC19!!

Route was finalized and released, as were the GPX files; all SWAG was in hand.....shirts and hats looked great.

Last minute update to checkpoint 1 Cedar City location, final pickup of shirts and hats, and then delivery of all SWAG to SLRC a week before the event. I did have a truck search conducted by Mexico customs but Rebecca at the Alcalde's office got me cleared through customs with no problem.

When Bob Roger and I arrived on Wednesday there were already about 10-15 riders to greet us at Hotel Araiza. Miles was there having ridden his side car to the start (he wasn't riding 3FC....just wanted to be there to help with the set up); the Canadian Kamakazi were there (Brian Hooker, Terry Burrill, Kim Coubrough) – they departed Calgary and successfully completed a Border-to-Border Insanity in 23 hours and a handful of minutes. John Cooper (Start Director), Colleen Sepulveda, and a number of others were busy setting up the tables and sorting the gear in preparation for Thursday's check in process.

By Wednesday afternoon the team of **Cooper**, **Sepulveda**, **Gullery**, **Miles**, et al, had the room and SWAG system arranged and ready for Thursday morning's 10:00 am check-in. The only thing left for me to do was to adjourn to the lounge, order a margarita and socialize while scripting the Agenda for Thursday's Mexican Dinner Buffet!!I did my

best with the margarita's.

Thursday morning the Team kicked off the 3FC19 rider check-in process.....it was flawless. They did a great job!

John Cooper took over the arrangements of the banquet room and coordinated hanging the Thirty-three foot 3FC Welcome banner. Due to excessive winds John smartly decided to hang it in banquet room.

That evening at the Buffet, John took the stage and started the evening's festivities. He introduced the Three Flags Chairman who welcomed everyone,

called everyone up to the stage for a group photo, and presented the evenings agenda. Gonzo also mentioned the recognition of Rider Volunteers who manned the check-in stations. He explained that Volunteer hats were designed for Committee members (Orange) and rider volunteers (yellow);



checkpoint volunteers would also be wearing these hats.

Oscar Palacio, SCMA's



Mexico Representative, addressed the riders and welcomed everyone to Mexico. Oscar got some laughs when he apologized for not riding this year's Three Flags because he didn't have a bike. Seems he sold his bike in anticipation of the arrival of a new bike he purchased.....Oooops, it didn't arrive on time.

Gonzo then presented Oscar with an appreciation SWAG bag for his hard work in coordinating hotels, city government, Mexican

Customs, and USA Customs. For the benefit of our Mexican sponsors (The Mayor of SLRC and his department heads, Araiza Staff members, US Customs) Gonzo and Oscar displayed and described each SWAG item in the bag.

The Alcalde (Mayor) of San Luis Rio Colorado, **Santos González**



Yescas, took the stage and welcomed us to Mexico. He spoke in Spanish, and his Director of Tourism, Ms Rebeca Ching, interpreted for him. It was a wonderful welcome and he had the audience cracking up with a few, funny anecdotes.

The buffet dinner was amazing!!! It was chef styled Mexican dishes with

delicious spices and toppings available. Very tasty and filling.....extra portions available for all. During dessert the agenda was resumed with Gonzo calling the assembly to order and, since 3FC is the largest assembly of members, declared the evening as an "All Members" meeting. Prior SCMA Chairmen (Steve Shulman) and 3FC Chairpersons (Jane

Usatin, Steve Shulman, Chris White, Rodney Chew) were recognized as riding the event this year.

In 2017, the Good Samaritan award was overlooked by mistake. **Mike Burges** had provided first aid to victims in a bad, non-3FC crash, so Gonzo gave him recognition at the start, announcing he would also



receive recognition at the Finish Banquet along with the 2019 Good Samaritan. The evening progressed quickly with reading of the rules, discussion of Passport Book contents (Rodney Chew), Start Process (member agreement to allow 2:00am chip drop in bucket), Route Presentation (Steve Andrus), Twitter presentation (Colleen Sepulveda), Border Crossing/re-entry to USA, Raffle prizes (pre-drawn), photographs to flickr, Purpose of Call-Line), and ending with the "First Timers" Q&A meeting.

With that, a motion was made to end the meeting and, with anticipation of a great 3FC

ride, we all called it a night. When I got to my room, **John Mickus** was already zonked out; he had to get up very early, as he was the designated 3:30 am holder of the "Start Bucket".



Day 1 - Friday

Bob Roger and I headed out at 5:00am and got in the #3 lane to cross the border. This lane was for "Motorcycle Event" only, and despite being in a long line of motorcyclists it only took us about 30 minutes to cross back into USA!!!

Soon we were on our way out of San Luis, taking a shortcut via AZ-195 to reach US-95 and head to Quartzite about 106 miles north. This was a flat out ride through darkness in the Sonoran Desert! We passed the Yuma Proving Grounds,

and some huge, wind-eroded rocks that were reminiscent of Monument Valley. Being 6-7:00am twilight had come upon us, the sun was slowly rising, and the air, fresh and clear and bearing the scent of the desert, was beginning to warm. We rolled into Quartzsite and decided not to visit the famous monument to Hi Jolly, a Syrian camel master who came to the US in 1856 with a number of camels via a project started by Secretary of War – Jefferson Davis before he became the President of the Confederacy.



In Quartzsite we refueled at the Chevron Station

and then continued on to Congress where we stopped for breakfast at Nichols West. From there the ride became interesting as we jumped onto AZ-89, rode past the memorial to the "Granite Mountain Hotshots" firefighters, and headed up the mountain twisties into Yarnell then on to Prescott. After tanking up north of Prescott we continued north on 89 to I-40 east of Ash Fork and rode through Flagstaff on towards Page.

We stopped at the Shell station in Page for fuel and a brief rest. It was getting hot so I decided to don the cooling vest that was swimming in a ZipLok bag full of water. Wearing it made a big difference as it allowed my body temp to cool off a little. But the important thing I failed to do was to eat a meal....instead, after drinking a some water and having a

cliff bar, we got back in the saddle and headed to Kanab.

This is where two things happened to me....first, the cooling jacket was completely evaporated and I was now feeling the heat and, second, I personally was depleted of energy! With that happening to me, Bob and I stopped at McD's, which was going to close in 20 minutes, and had a quick hamburger and coke....that got the energy level back up and I was able to resume the final leg of 80 miles to Cedar City checkpoint.

Forty miles later, after leaving Kanab, we came upon the UT-14 turnoff that would take us to an altitude around 10,000 feet. We had been looking forward to this leg not just because the altitude would make the temperatures cooler, but also for the scenery and vistas we would encounter. This forty-mile section of road is absolutely a joy to ride as it passes through wooded areas, open fields, sweeping curves, and a few twisties.

When we arrived in Cedar City we were surprised to find the street taking us to the checkpoint completely blocked off for a city event. We figured out how to get around

the event and finally found the checkpoint.
Checkpoint #1 – Cedar City was manned
by the **Duey Vernon and the Christian Motorcycle Association** members from
Henderson NV and Cedar City UT. They
had a great setup with excellent snacks,
water, and soft drinks!

After hanging with the Checkpoint CMA volunteers for a while, Bob and I left for our motel room and an evening dinner.



Day 2 - Saturday

I had not been feeling well since getting overheated in Kanab. Either that or I didn't sleep well. Whichever the cause, Bob decided that we would slab it to Mountain Home via the interstate. (I don't think either of us was happy about that decision because our plan was



to ride the route on days 1,2, and 4. Day 3 we were planning on riding the Lolo Pass US-12, a Best 15 USA Road, between Lewiston ID and Lolo MT.)

The 3FC route for Day 2 was an awesome route.....one that I had ridden twice before. It would take riders through the Great Basin National Park, on

US-50 between Ely and Eureka, then 278N to Elko to get on NV-225/ID-51 into Mountain Home. These roads are awesome as riders travel over the NV high desert with its varying topography and vistas!

While on I-15 I kept thinking we should've ridden the route, but later, I was glad Bob had made the decision to slab it via I-15 and I-84 to Mountain Home. I struggled all day with my riding.....just wasn't comfortable. But we made it to the Mountain Home checkpoint, had a good dinner, and then I hit the sack with hopes of feeling better in the morning.

Hats off to Tim Wanamaker and Sherry Sutherland for organizing Checkpoint #2 and teaming with the local CMA.

Day 3 – Sunday

This was the day that Bob and I wanted to ride the Lolo Pass.

The route itself was to take US-20 out of MH to ID-75. Neither Bob nor I had been on these two roads before so it was frustrating for us to miss out on it. Hwy 75 will probably be known as the best road of 2019! It takes riders through every imaginable road style!! Some 140 miles later, riders were then treated to another great ride as they connected onto US-93 and headed into Lolo and then Missoula to head west on I-90 to reach the 3rd checkpoint in Wallace, ID.

But Bob and I had plans to ride the Lolo Pass for the Best 15 USA Roads. We headed west on I-84 to Boise to take ID-55 to US-95 to get onto US-12 Lolo Pass. All three roads were amazing! We had a great time riding them. A quick story, we were somewhere on 95, coming out of a gas station, when we saw **Betty McCloskey** zip by in her Slingshot. We quickly took off in chase of her and almost caught up to her. But she noticed us in the mirror and opened the throttle to the slingshot and left us in the dust! We never caught up to her after that!

Larry Wanamaker (Checkpoint Captain) and Susan Ziese and greeted riders at the checkpoint room that the Wallace Inn provided for 3FC. Dinner later that night was with Larry and Sue at a local restaurant within walking distance.


Day 4 – Monday.

Due to conditions beyond 3FC control, the planned route for the day would be iffy. The route was to take riders to Coeur d'Alene and north through Sandpoint into

Canada to connect onto 3A for Kootenay Bay to catch the ferry to Balfour and on to Hwy 6 to Nakusp and Fauquier Ferry then into Vernon.

Unfortunately, the Kootenay Ferry companies were experiencing an employee strike and, although one of the ferryboats became available, schedules were going to be risky. It was announced to everyone (at start buffet and CkPt#3) to decide on their own how they wanted to handle the Day 4 route. Some did get to ride the ferry, some took Hwy 3 west to 6 and then headed north to Nakusp, and some took 97 out of Spokane. No matter which route was taken, all were treated to the beauty of British Columbia's lakes, woods, and delightful towns.



We arrived in Vernon and found the Vernon Lodge....YAAAAYYY.....we were finishers! 
"If this is your 2nd year of riding Three Flags, please sit down"
