## Chairman's Letter

As I write this, my calendar says three weeks until I leave for a few days in SoCal then head to Mexicali to help open the 2022 Three Flags Classic. I'm looking forward to finally riding this Tour after two years postponement due to the borders being closed for Covid. The entire Three Flags committee has done a ton of work to make this an outstanding tour for us!

Like you, I have a comprehensive checklist of things I need to do before heading out on any major motorcycle trip including route planning, hotel reservations, bike prep, and final packing.

I have a special "kink" in this year's ride as I'm combining the 3FC with the USA Four Corners Tour. The "kink" is the plan shows the total miles to be a little over 12,700 so I need an oil and rear tire change along the way. On my bike prep list, I called my local dealer yesterday and found that my three preferred tire options were out of stock in his inventory and showing backordered in three other distributor systems. Thanks to our Vice-Chairman, Rodney Chew, I found the tires I wanted in stock at GoAZ in Scottsdale, AZ. So I revised my route to SoCal for a stop in Scottsdale for my new tires and service. My tires still have more than enough tread to make it to Scottsdale and the service is really not due until I have another 1,500 miles on my scooter. Now, I need to call ahead to my next tire and service dealer in the NW USA and prepay for my tires and schedule the service. Point of all this is to not wait to the last minute to prepare for your tours. The supply chain problems are still an issue and you don't want your touring impacted.

the Ride Chairman, has published important information you need to act upon such as Mexican Insurance, and Canada's ArriveCan app. Also double check your passport to make sure it hasn't or won't soon expire. You can still replace it with expedited service request if you act quick. (Don't ask me about this little trip-wire...)

As a reminder, a lot of people are taking road trips for vacation this summer. The National Parks are requiring reservations for entry during "prime visitation hours" and many hotels are booked. Please consider booking your hotels ahead of time. No one enjoys having to ride an extra couple of hours in the dark, hungry, thirsty, and looking for a bed.

Be sure to remember to set up your ride in Spotwalla for documenting your ride. I just checked and I have rides from over 10 years documented in Spotwalla. I just retired a Spot Gen3 and replaced it with a Spot Trace. I plan to use both the Trace and the SWTracker app with Spotwalla. Easy to post pictures to Spotwalla with SWTracker on the road.

I look forward to seeing you in Mexicali, at the checkpoints, and at the finish in Penticton. If you haven't got your ticket for Three Flags and want to go at the last minute, there are a few resell tickets available.

SCMA will continue to offer challenge for SCMA members riding the CA Series.

This is a challenge that is completely doable, within reach of everyone, especially members in the southwest region or within a few states close to California.

With the introduction of the California Best 15 Roads, SCMA now has 3 rides with destinations that are often colocated with each other.

The Board of Directors came up with the idea of recognizing those riders who successfully complete the full CA Adventure Series in one calendar year between January 1st and November 30th.

The award is very similar to the SCMA Triple Crown and is a beautiful plaque to display in your home.

The **CA Triple Crown** will join the ranks of the other major awards designed to recognize riders that accomplish riding a significant distance in the calendar year.



Those other major awards are the **Triple Crown** award for riding three of the premier events, and the **Premier Grand Slam** for riding all seven premier events in a single calendar year.





The sixteenth road will remain on the list so that a ride registrant may omit any one road from the list, then ride 15 roads to qualify as a finisher. This is a tough ride challenge ... in the first nine years that this Challenge has been offered, there have been 55 finishes which were completed by only 41 riders. Through 2019, just nine SCMA long distance riders have taken the Challenge more than once! - 1. Acadia National Park (Maine): Park Loop 34 mile one way road.
- 2. Tunnel of Trees Plus MI 22 (Michigan): Cross Village MI 119 to Harbor Springs, US 31 to Traverse City, MI 22 to Empire, 164 miles.
- 3. Great River Road (Wisconsin): Prairie du Chien WI 35 to LaCrosse, 63 miles.
- 4. Theodore Roosevelt NP Medora (North Dakota): I-94 exit 24 or exit 27. Ride Park Loop, 35 miles.
- 5. Iron Mountain Road in the Black Hills (South Dakota): Keystone US16A to Custer, 34 miles.
- 6. The Big Horn Mountains (Wyoming): Ranchester US14 to Grey Bull, 79 miles.
- 7. Northwest Passage Scenic Byway (Idaho): Lolo US12 to Kooskia, 134 miles.
- 8. Payette River Scenic Byway (Idaho): Cascade ID55 to Horseshoe Bend, 51 miles.
- 9. Dinosaur Diamond Prehistoric Highway (Utah): I-70 exit 204 UT128 to Moab, 45 miles.
- 10. San Juan Skyway (Colorado): Placerville CO145 to Cortez, 83 miles.
- 11. The Enchanted Circle Scenic Byway (New Mexico): Counter-clockwise: Taos US64 to Eagle Nest, NM38 to Questa, NM522 back to Taos, 82 mile loop.
- 12. The Pig Trail (Arkansas): Eureka Springs AR23 to Ozark, 80 miles.
- 13. Cherohala Skyway (Tennessee/North Carolina): Tellico Plains, TN onto TN165 to NC143 to Robbinsville NC, 53 miles.
- 14. Blue Ridge Parkway (North Carolina/Virginia): ANY 150 mile section.
- 15. The Triple Nickel (Ohio): Little Hocking OH555 to Zanesville, 62 miles.
- 16. MY FAVORITE ROAD: The registrant can choose ANY US Road that is not already on this list! This one will also require the receipts and photos. By using this choice, the registrant can omit any one of the other 15 roads on the list.

There are Sixteen roads listed, but only FIFTEEN are required to be a Challenge finisher, the registrant can eliminate any ONE of the 16 roads offered. If you opt to ride "Tour Favorite Road" it cannot be one of the 15 (as in doing one of the 15 a second time.



# NEXUS CARD RENEWALS - Check yours now -

Just as an FYI, and a reminder for SCMA members to check the expiry dates on your Nexus Trusted Traveler Program cards.

I checked mine today, and found the 5-year expiry date had passed on my birthday this year.

THERE WAS NO WARNING, advice, email, text, NOTHING.

Apparently this is due to the Nexus offices being CLOSED while the borders are closed.

# Founder of Four Corners Park in Madawaska honored with national award

MADAWASKA, Maine — The founder of the only park in the world dedicated to long-distance motorcycling, located in northern Aroostook County, recently received a prestigious award for his support and promotion of cross-country motorcycle adventures.

Joe LaChance, 77, who founded Four Corners Park in Madawaska, said he was humbled to receive the 2022 Southern California Motorcycle Association Legacy Award.

"Have you ever been in an airplane and they throw you off without a parachute? It was like that, wow," LaChance said of receiving the award.

Four Corners Park is named for its location in the most northeastern town in the United States. Motorcyclists tour the four corners of the country, which also include San Ysidro, California; Blaine, Washington; and Key West, Florida. Motorcyclists who complete the intercontinental journey within 21 days receive a Four Corners Award, recognized by the motorcycling community. The Madawaska Park welcomes about 4,000 visitors each year.

is one of the Four Corners of Maine.

Members of the Southern California Motorcycle Association board traveled from all over the United States to Madawaska to present the award to LaChance on Friday, Aug. 5.

Despite its name, the club is no longer based in California where it began in 1960 (actually 1968), and now sports 600 members from countries throughout the world. The group has bestowed the Legacy Award to only 12 people in its history, including

**LaChance.** (SCMA Editor correction to this statement: The SCMA is based in Southern California with board members/administrators residing across USA/MEX/CAN, members in three continents, and 1500+ subscribers across 5 continents.)

LaChance, who said he has been a motorcycle enthusiast since he was 20 years old, first conceived the Four Corners Park in 2000 as a way to draw motorcycle tourism to the small northern Maine town.

The park was established in 2008 with the support of community members through donations and volunteer efforts spearheaded by LaChance.

California Club board member Charles Lamb of Virginia said he has visited Madawaska about 20 times on his motorcycle over the years. Lamb, who became friends with LaChance through the motorcycling community, was also a major contributor to the construction of Four Corners Park.

"It's a beautiful destination that brings people into town and kind of celebrates long distance motorcycle riding," Lamb said.

People from the United States, Mexico, Canada, Europe and Africa make the trip to Four Corners Park specifically to visit one of the four corners of the country, Lamb said.

Since the park's inception, LaChance and his wife, Diane LaChance, have expanded Four Corners Park to include a

visitors center, parking lot and features designed for photo opportunities.

Among these is Mr. Knucklehead, a hollow fiberglass mooseshaped structure named after a Harley-Davidson motorcycle engine.

The LaChances first met at a biker party 37 years ago.

"He wanted a woman who loved motorcycles, and I wanted a man who loved motorcycles. We had that much in common to begin with and soon realized we have a lot more than motorcycles in common, believe me. We have the same values," Diane LaChance said.

A retired accountant originally from Edmundston, New Brunswick, Diane LaChance serves as treasurer of the non-profit Four Corners Park Association, for which her husband acts as president.

They spend most of their summers overseeing the park and have a camera in their home so they can see when new visitors arrive there and greet them in person.

LaChance describes her husband as kind, funny, generous and passionate when it comes to work. He owned LaChance apartments while working as a machine tender on Machine No. 4 for the former Fraser Paper Co., now Twin Rivers Paper in Madawaska.

Aroostook County administrator Ryan D. Pelletier got to know the LaChances while he served as Madawaska town manager.

"Joe is one of the nicest people I got to know in Madawaska during my time there," Pelletier said. "He was also one of the first people to introduce themselves to me as he wanted to get my signature for the Four Corners Award that is given to all finishers

of the Four Corners Tour. He and Diane are and have been pillars in the community for decades. I am so happy for him to be recognized and congratulate him on this prestigious award."

The LaChances were named business people of the year in 1988 and Joe LaChance was named 1997 Greater Madawaska Citizen of the Year.

Although thankful to receive his latest award, Joe LaChance does not see what all the fuss is about.

"I'm just a regular citizen from Madawaska with a motorcycle," he said.

# The Great Lakes Cabot Trail Tour



SCMA is proud to announce a new Premier Ride for 2022 titled The **Great Lakes Cabot Trail Tour**.

The Tour will be a self-guided ride to twelve designated checkpoints scattered along a suggested route through the northeastern United States and Southeastern Canada. The preferred starting point would be the Perry Monument on the Presque Isle peninsula in Erie, PA, though riders from western Canada may want to begin at Thunder Bay, Ontario. From Erie, the next checkpoint is Niagara Falls, on either the US of Canadian side. From New York there are several checkpoints through Vermont and New Hampshire before crossing Maine into New Brunswick and on to Nova Scotia to ride the Cabot Trail.

Next is a return to the US with a checkpoint at the SCMA Four Corners Park in Madawaska ME. Then the ride heads back into Canada to ride along the St. Lawrence River to the walled cities" of Quebec and Montreal.

The suggested route turns west away from the St Lawrence River through Ottawa and Sudbury to the north shores of Lake Huron and Lake Superior. The route follows the shoreline of Lake Superior back into the US, turns the corner at Duluth MN, and heads east through Wisconsin into the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. After a ride over the famous Mackinaw Bridge, the 4200 mile long Tour finishes in Mackinaw City MI,

All 12 checkpoints must be visited. Proof of the visits will be a personal ride log containing a photo from each checkpoint that includes the rider, the motorcycle, and a sign or landmark showing the location, and a sales receipt showing the date and location.

The registrant will have a two-year window to complete the ride, BUT all checkpoints must be visited in one calendar year.

ALL riders will depart Mexicali using the WEST border station as it will be open and on the route. Directions are attached.

Also, please remember the following when checking in for the Start at the Araiza Hotel:

- 1. Bring evidence of Mexican Insurance
- 2. Bring your motorcycle driver's license
- 3. Ensure you have downloaded the ArriveCan application on your phone. You must advise Canada of your arrival date within 72 hours of arrival in Canada. In most cases you'll be doing this in after or about the time you arrive at the Longmont, Colorado checkpoint.



### **ARRIVING IN MEXICALI**

Upon arrival at the ARAIZA TFC check-in hotel you'll spot the US, Mexican, and Canadian flags at the entrance to the hotel. You may also spot the LED sign welcoming riders. You may park temporarily in front of the hotel lobby upon arrival. Once you check-in to the hotel please follow instructions from SCMA personnel and park in the designated motorcycle parking area for Three Flag riders. If you are staying elsewhere go directly to designated parking and come into the hotel.

### TFC CHECK-IN AT THREE FLAG TABLES

When you get to the Araiza Hotel the first thing you'll want to do is to have your photograph taken. This can and should be done as soon as you get to the Araiza Hotel and as early as 2 days before check-in on August 31st. Photographs prior to check-in will be done in the hotel lobby. These photographs will be placed in your individual passport and provided to you at TFC check-in. If at all possible get the photograph taken early. On August 31, 2022 photographs will be taken in the TFC check-in room but expect a line.

TFC Check-in will begin sometime between 10:00 and 11:00 AM on Wednesday August 31, 2022 but photographs will start earlier. Please have your driver's license and Mexican Insurance documents with you to expedite the process.

### FIRST-TIME RIDERS MEETING

Unlike previous years, the first-time riders meeting will take place **BEFORE** dinner rather than after dinner. The first-timers meeting starts at 3:30 PM, will last about an hour, unless there are questions, in which case it may finish right before dinner. Dinner will be at 5:00 PM. This meeting is not mandatory but encouraged as those conducting it have been on the ride for many years and will provide you valuable information to make your ride fun and safe. Let comers will still be able to check-in after dinner.

### TURN-BY-TURN ROUTE SHEETS

The Three Flags Classic is generally a back roads route. All roads are paved

but the route is generally more scenic than Interstates. There are a number of ways to follow the TFC route. You may have downloaded the GPX file found on the SC-MA web page, charted the route on paper maps, or a number of other methods. We will provide riders turn-by-turn route sheets from start to finish if they wish to navigate using these sheets. While we believe they are accurate, we suggest you know exactly where you are at all times in case an error has been made. Verifications to these sheets can be by maps on phones, navigation systems or paper maps. Please pay attention to where you are so you can make checkpoints on time.

### **START CARDS**

Every rider will receive a **START CARD**. Consider filling out this card the day **BEFORE** you leave on the ride. **The start of the rides is between the hours of 2:30 AM and 5:00 AM on Thursday, September 1, 2022**.

In the lobby of the hotel you will find coffee, water, and possibly some snacks. There will be TFC personnel there to collect **YOUR** Start card. Please have your wrist band on and your passport available when turning in your Start Card. You may **NOT** turn in a Start Card for any other rider. Each rider must turn in one Start Card and it **MUST** be your own!

### **BANQUET IN PENTICTON**

When you arrive in Penticton there will be TFC personnel there to help direct you to the TFC Finishers check-in table. They'll also direct you to parking. We will have large bags for your use to take your gear to your hotel room, if needed. Please return them to the lobby so others can use them. There is a limited supply.

### DO NOT REMOVE YOUR WRISTBAND





### TRAVEL ESSENTIALS

As I mentioned in the last newsletter I was going to provide a list of essentials to think about before embarking on a long motorcycle ride. While many of these items may not be necessary for you, reviewing it may help you think of other items you may want to bring.

I usually use this list before I get ready to pack my bike. One item I am very fond of are Rok Straps instead of the traditional bungie cords. When in desert heat I've actually had bungie cords break.

If you found a black Joe Rocket jacket in the westbound lanes of I-40 with a roll of quarters in the inside pocket, it's mine and I'd love to get it back. I was on the way back from a USA Four Corners trip and it was 106 degrees. When I arrived in Needles, California my bungie cords melted and my jacket was gone. I've since used Rok Straps. If you return the jacket, you can keep the quarters.

In any case you can add to this list or subtract from it but I like to refer to it because I used to get just far away from home when I realized I forgot something. Hopefully this will help you.

I hope to see many of you in Mexicali in August at the Three Flags check-in. Until then...
