SCMA Rides - Review of 2023

Presenting the 2023 review of all of the Premier Tours offered by the SCMA. A lot of great times! You can see more ride details on www.sc-ma.com. The SCMA was founded in 1968. The Rides were started at different times over the years. Some have been around for a long time and some were started in recent years of the long history of the group.

- USA Four Corners Tour™, since 1984, probably the most challenging ride
- Three Flags Classic, since 1976, highest number of riders each year
- California Adventures Series, since about 2006, lots of variety of roads all in California
- Best 15 US Roads, since 2011, annual choice of 15 roads in the US
- Great Lakes Cabot Trail Tour, since 2022, newest and focused on the Northeastern US

USA Four Corners Tour™

The AAA map above of the United States has red tacks identifying each of the required stops for the USA Four Corners Tour™: San Ysidro, California; Blaine, Washington; Madawaska, Maine; Key West, Florida plus the geographical center of the US in Lebanon, Kansas. The True X version is to go through Lebanon, Kansas after the first corner and between rides to the other corners of the US. You can choose what order to visit each corner in 21 days for the regular 4 Corners and 26 days for the True X.

From Dannie Fox – USA Four Corners Ride Chair

- 78 entries this year

Three Flags Classic (TFC)

The Three Flags Classic is an annual 4-day or 5-day event motorcycling from Mexico to Canada or the reverse over the US Labor Day weekend with specified checkpoints on a different route each year.

Mark Burdick - TFC Ride Chair

Many of us on the Three Flags Committee this year remember what it was like to work on the 45th TFC event in both 2020 and 2021 and having to wait until 2022 for the 45th TFC due to Covid delays. The ride in 2022 was the longer 5-day event in honor of the milestone year since it was originally planned for 2020. The TFC after a milestone longer ride is typically a smaller group.

In 2023, we had more than 200 attendees and about 175 riders. We tried a few different things this year. We heard about many of the prior ride changes over the 40+ years from riders as the times and demographics change. In 2023, we planned check-in and Start Banquet on the Wednesday before the ride, a rest and prepare day on Thursday with departure on Friday. Most attendees were positive about the change after trying the change. We also distributed the heavier swag (plaques, t-shirts, hats) in a quick stop on the first



day of the ride. We saved lots of time and effort for everyone by avoiding the big task of getting the swag to the start and distributing it at check-in. We intend to make it more efficient for everyone in 2024. The route for 2024 is mostly clear. It won't be too far east toward heat or too far west toward traffic. We anticipate the number of Mexican citizens participating in the TFC to continue increasing. More on 2024 next month.

This series has a lot of variety with 3 different areas of focus and the opportunity to do all three for the California Adventure Series Triple Crown.

The Baja Challenge route is 100% paved. The ride is about 1600 kilometers/1000 miles in 24 hours. There is also a tourist tour the day after the ride certification in Cabo. Here are the highlights of this endurance type ride that has captured the interest of some of our members in Arizona!

The ride was created by our affiliate group AMORAK and avid rider Felipe Salmán.



Certification ride endorsed and organized by the Association of Endurance and High Mileage Motorcyclists AC (AMORAK) where Endurance Motorcycling is practiced and which will take place within the states of Baja California and Baja California Sur following 100% asphalt roads with a length of just over 1,600 kilometers, and a limit of 24 hours to travel it from start to finish.

The route was developed by the experienced motorcyclist Felipe Salmán, which begins at the TIJUANA WHERE THE COUNTRY BEGINS sign located in the Friendship Park in Tijuana, Baja California and ends at the KM 0 sign located in the Amelia Wilkes Ceseña Park in Cabo San Lucas, Baja California Sur, but not before enjoying one of the most scenic roads such as **Mexico Highway 1**.

The day after finishing the certification ceremony of the La Baja 2024 Challenge, our friends from Moto Turismo in La Baja have prepared a tourist tour for us through some of the most emblematic points in southern Baja California where we can ride, be together and have fun on the 14th and January 15, so don't forget to include your swimsuit to enjoy the beaches of this paradise state.
